Early in our marriage our faith was enlivened by hours of volunteering as we sought to be in solidarity with those on the margins. Our youthful faith was challenged as our family grew, and our available time and energy shrunk. It called us to enter more deeply into the complexity of the great commandment and to spend more time in prayer.

Returning to the source of all love helps us to discern how we can be in solidarity with our neighbour in new ways. May God's grace help us, like the Thessalonians, to receive "the word with joy," seeking continuously to be people of justice, living our faith in a way that makes love known.
