How baffling you are, Oh Church, and yet how I love you! How you have made me suffer, and yet how much I owe you! I would like to see you destroyed, and yet I need your presence. You have given me so much scandal and yet how have made me understand what sanctity is. I have seen nothing in the world more devoted to obscurity, more compromised, more false, and yet I have touched nothing more pure, more generous, more beautiful. How often I have wanted to shut the doors of my soul in your face, and how often I have prayed to die in the safety of your arms.

Carlo Carretto, (Italian author, 1910-1988)

On the Solemnity of Pentecost, the words of this Italian writer are of insight and comfort. As we celebrate the birth of the Church, the cited quote has relevance in our own day and resonates with so many. Carlo Carretto was born in northern Italy, at the base of the Alp mountains. His early life had him involved in the robust catechetical formation program of "Azione Cattolica". This "Catholic Action" movement strove to engage lay people in the important mission of politcal and social life. Locked in the battle of the 20th century's rise of the anti-Catholic forces of fascism and marxism, the young Carlo lived the mystery of the Church in trying to rigourously defend and promote her and at the same time feeling terribly let-down, hurt and betrayed by her. As we read from the Acts of the Apostles, this two-fold sense of scandal and consolation has been present from the Churches' origins and throughout her troubled and inspiring history. It is never easy to confront the reality of sin; the Church, like family life, understands this combined ongoing mystery of sinners and saints. At 44 years of age, he chose to suspend his political aspirations and withdraw to life as a hermit in Algeria, in the Sahara Desert. For 20 years, Carlo felt that the best means to social change was taking up an even more determined and focused life of prayer and intercession. He moved back to Italy and settled around Assisi directing select surrounding monasteries and welcoming seeking pilgrims to the great basilicas of St. Francis and Clare.

As evidenced by the quote above, his writings convey a depth of genuine, hardearned experience for anyone who commits themselves to the necessary vulnerability/resilience of Christian discipleship and life-long communion with the Church.

We cannot come together in fellowship, to pray, praise and place our petitions before our God. But fear not, the church has faced worse challenges in the past. Our hope is in the Lord who made heaven and earth.

Happy Pentecost, Happy Birthday to the church.

RESTRICTIONS FOR ALL PARISHES IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF TORONTO AS OF MAY 13TH, 2021

Parishes must restrict attendance inside the church to NO MASS GATHERINGS OF MORE THAN 10 people, including priests hearing confessions or a staff member/volunteer required to monitor capacity restrictions. Due to these measures, public Masses must be temporarily cancelled.



Weddings, funerals and baptisms are restricted to 10 per-

sons, including those who are involved in ministry (priest, cantor, etc.). First Holy Communion, First Reconciliation and Confirmations are postponed at this time.
