TRINITY SUNDAY

When we separate gender from generation the very word loses its meaning. Gender is based on the root "gen" (same as words like generous, generate, genitals, progeny) that means to produce or give birth. Gender basically means "the manner in which you generate." There are only two ways to generate: as a father or as a mother.

- Christopher West, (1969-), Author of numerous books and Speaker of, St. Pope John Paul II's, Theology of the Body

The very likable Christopher West offers us an important witness of the catechesis from the Wednesday General Audiences of Pope John Paul II. At the beginning of his Pontificate, JP II wanted to provide a thorough response to the challenge of the sexual revolution. The Holy Father's robust teaching follows the same insight as that of Our Lord when He himself was questioned on God's plan for human sexuality. Responding to the question on divorce, Jesus makes reference to God's plan from the beginning when He made them male and female. Jesus acknowledges the "hardness of heart" that has distorted God's original plan. Jesus situates all questions about sexual morality within the greater mystery of the nuptial union – the eternal love of bridegroom for his bride and His desire to consummate the embrace. Where God's intention for the genders of male and female and their perennial attraction to each other is intended so to spark and fuel an infinite love, our current culture has distorted and falsified love into an infinite amount of genders.

On this Trinity Sunday, the Church directs us to adoring the revelation of God's inner life and how He created us in His image and likeness. It is comforting and reassuring that a new generation of young theologians, like Christopher West, are setting their efforts on putting into practice what Scripture has declared to be true. His podcast, (Ask Christopher West), hosted by his wife, Wendy, is a fantastic resource for further appreciating and studying God's plan for sex, love, gender and marriage. As Christopher West so oftenly says, "If you have a body, this theology is for you."

RESTRICTIONS FOR ALL PARISHES IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF TORONTO AS OF MAY 20TH, 2021

Before the implementation of the "Roadmap to Reopen", current measures for places of worship (limit of 10 both inside and outside) remain in place.



- Step 1 of the "Roadmap to Reopen" is expected to be introduced the week of June 14. Each step will last a minimum of 21 days - movement to the next step is also impacted by the number of positive Covid-19 cases in the province, demand on the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) in hospitals as well as the vaccination rate for Ontarians.
- Step 1 limits indoor gatherings at places of worship to the current hard cap of 10 people. In Step 1, outdoor religious services may be conducted without limits as long as 2 m distancing is maintained.
- Step 2 first week of July at the earliest places of worship are permitted 15% capacity.
- Step 3 at least 21 days following the start of Step 2 places of worship are permitted "larger indoor services, rites or ceremonies" - no specific number or percentage is provided.

All day Adoration will be live streamed and will conclude with Benediction (no Mass at 7pm).


