
PARISH MISSION

ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

The Father was most edified by her modesty and of her timidness, but he was even more so when he had spoken with her and had learned what a virtuous life she led. He had spoken to her of Christianity and because he found her so docile, which he pressed her to be instructed and to attend the chapel. She was overjoyed, because she had found her long desired occasion for embracing the Christian Faith. After she recovered from her injury, which she had done with assiduity her attendance at the chapel.

The Father had seen clearly that the Holy Spirit enlightened the eyes of her soul to see the truth of our religion and to touch her heart to embrace it. After his first conversion with Tekakwitha, he believed seeing God had a great intention for this girl, because of this reason that he had resolved and promised to grant the grace she ardently desired of being baptized.

From the earliest recorded Jesuit journals about the life of St. Kateri Tekakwitha an important and essential insight is to be appreciated in the current conversation regarding English and French interactions amongst Indigenous peoples. In the life of this "Lily of the Mohawks", we see fulfilled the ardent desire that all peoples are called to know and love Jesus Christ. It is right to invoke her intercession amongst all the ferocious accusations being catapulted at our shared history.

We all ought to agree that "every child matters." An honest examination of conscience over the sins of the past is totally in keeping with the integrity of being a baptized Christian. If there is fear that even more evidence is still to come forward hiding or covering up further presumable atrocities, then the compelling data from the abortion rights coalition of Canada webpage also ought to be part of the conversation. Available on line, recorded data indicates that over the last decade, on average, over 350 abortions have been performed in the provinces of Yukon, Northwest Territories, and Nunavut. Of course, that number is significantly less than the on average 35000+ abortions performed in Ontario. We know transmittable diseases were prevalent in the initial encounters between Europeans and Indigenous people - St. Kateri herself being a victim of small pox at the age of 24. As the gospels plead, we long to see the revelation of Jesus Christ be recognized and acted upon consistently in dealing with the sensitive work of confronting evil. With his help and through the intercession of St. Kateri, may the conversation be less arduous.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The readings this weekend are commonly used at funerals and they present a perspective on death. The first reading, for instance, taken from Wisdom chapter 1, verse 13, says in no uncertain terms that "God did not make death. God does not delight in the death of the living, for he created all the things that they might exist." A definite pro life statement if ever I heard one.



According to Wisdom death is a travesty. We are born, we live, and at some stage our life is taken from us, some of us sooner than later. And it leaves many unanswered questions. Did we fulfill our purpose? Did we die too soon? Why do we grow close to others? And then suddenly they are taken away from us? Does life mean anything if those that we love are suddenly wrenched out of our existence, sometimes in very sudden and unexpected way?

Well, this was the scenario in the Gospel reading where a young girl, the daughter of Jairus, a synagogue official, had passed away. Mark sets up a direct contrast between the crowd wailing and weeping and even ridiculing Jesus (when he claims that the girl is not dead, only asleep) and the parents who went along with Jesus to the child's bedside trusting in his words, "Do not be afraid, only have faith."

This entire scene is sacramental in nature pointing forward to Baptism, where we receive the gift of new life and the Eucharistic pledge that he will raise us up on the last day.

For those of us who have experienced the bitter taste of death, who have lost a brother, sister, father, mother, even a spouse or a child. These words resonate in our hearts. Do not be afraid. Just have faith. Jesus has conquered death. Amen As father Bernard moves on from our parish into retirement we wish him God's most abundant blessings and thank him for the tremendous love and commitment he shared in his ministry her at St. Marguerite.

RESTRICTIONS FOR ALL PARISHES IN THE ARCHDIOCESE OF **TORONTO AS OF JUNE 11TH, 2021**

The updated measures will result in places of worship opening at 15% capacity in Step 1 and 25% capacity in Step 2.

Attendance is limited to 15% capacity of the worship space (including those assisting - priest, cantor, etc.) for sacramental celebrations, with the exception of funerals (see below). Physical distancing must be observed at all times.

Funerals are limited to 50 people (including those assisting but not including funeral home staff) per direction from the Bereavement Authority of Ontario (BAO).

MASS REGISTRATION



As of this June 11th the regulations for places of Worship in Stage 1 were changed to allow 15% Register Worsnip in Stage 1 were changed to an capacity attendance at in person services (Masses). for Mass Given this information we have decided to do Online Registration ONLY for Weekend Masses with the capacity of 120 persons. Weekday Masses

will be on a first come first serve basis. The link for the following Sunday Masses will be posted but not active until Saturdays at 12 midnight; the link will be available until Fridays at 12 noon as we need to prepare lists for the weekend.

FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION

First Friday Adoration, is a Eucharistic adoration held the first Friday of every month (July 2nd) in the church. It begins with 9:00am Mass and is followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for the remainder of the day.

WHAT FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION PARTICIPANTS DO:

Come any time during the adoration hours (approximately 10:00 AM to 6:30 PM) to spend some quiet, prayerful time with Jesus. Adoration participants commit to specific time. These "Guardians of the Eucharist" ensure that the Blessed Sacrament is never left alone.

FIRST FRIDAY - HOLY HOUR



Please join us in this holy hour of prayers during the Eucharistic adoration on First Fridays of every month. We start with the 3 O'clock Prayer and the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00pm. Then, we continue with Prayers of Adoration, Thanksgiving, Reparation, and Intercession. We also pray the Eucharistic Rosary and the Litany of the Blessed Sacrament. We end the hour with a hymn of praise and adoration at 4:00pm.

The next Holy Hour will be on Friday, July 2nd. All are welcome.


