The Story of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Eastern Church begins its Church year with September. The September 8 date helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8.

Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the apocryphal *Protoevangelium of James* fills in the gap. This work has no historical value, but it does reflect the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child who will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story, like many biblical counterparts, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning.

Saint Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed." The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of our salvation, and asks for an increase of peace." Work is a fundamental right and a good for mankind, a useful good, worthy of man because it is an appropriate way for him to give expression to and enhance his human dignity. The Church teaches the value of work not only because it is always something that belongs to the person but also because of its nature as something necessary. Work is needed to form and maintain a family, to have a right to property, to contribute to the common good of the human family. In considering the moral implications that the question of work has for social life, the Church cannot fail to indicate unemployment as a "real social disaster" above all with regard to the younger generations.

- section 287, Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Catholic Church Under the collective experience of lockdowns and slow-staged reopenings, the Covid 19 interruption has greatly shifted the world of work. Having one's work being deemed as non-essential is demoralizing. Getting used to not leaving the house and waiting for the depositing of compensation payment is dangerous. The basic skills and habits of having to be punctual and presentable, reliable and engaged, diligent and focused has been altered. Working remotely or having no work to punch in for may have had the immediate benefit of a reprise from an office schedule and traffic avoidance, but its unintended consequences of mental health related depression, addiction, domestic violence are troubling realities especially if current restrictive measures are the new norm and here-to-stay. Further pressure from mandated vaccine requirements or compliance with intrusive social norms also seem to be part of the new work environment where one's employment can be terminated/canceled if one does not comply with questionable/ unquestionable public policy. For those who are having their rights and freedoms usurped by public policy, it is lamentable that the state has so intruded into areas where she is proving to be incompetent, divisive and destructive.

We entrust all these perennial and emerging concerns to our Lord who understands our striving to earn our daily bread. In this year of St. Joseph, we again turn to this valiant model as a humble yet radiant sign upholding the dignity of all workers. His family certainly appreciated his life sustaining contributions stemming from his simple yet skilled craftsmanship. The Church has so much to say in regards to labour, capital, economy and social justice; it would be so good and widely beneficial to have her teachings studied and put into practice
