I, Constantine Augustus, as well as Licinius Augustus, fortunately met near Milan and were considering everything that pertained to the public welfare and security, we thought – among other things which we saw would be for the good of many, those regulations pertaining to the reverence of the Divinity ought certainly to be made first, so that we might grant to the Christians and others full authority to observe that religion which each preferred; whence any Divinity whatsoever in the seat of the heavens may be propitious and kindly disposed to us and all who are placed under our rule. And thus by this wholesome counsel and most upright provision we thought to arrange that no one whatsoever should be denied the opportunity to give his heart to the observance of the Christian religion, or of that religion which he should think best for himself, so that the Supreme Deity, to whose worship we freely yield our hearts, may show in all things His usual favor and benevolence. Therefore, your Worship should know that it has pleased us to remove all conditions whatsoever, which were in the rescripts formerly given to you officially, concerning the Christian religion may do so freely and openly, without molestation.

- Emperor Constantine, The Edict of Milan (313 A.D.)

In the year 312, on the outskirts of Rome by the Tiber River, the military battle of Milvian Bridge proved definitive for Constantine to consolidate power and obtain the exalted role of Emperor. Prior to the battle, legend describes Constantine's vision of a fiery cross emblazoned against a noon day sky with the accompanying prophecy "in hoc signo vinces." Accordingly then, Constantine had the sign of the cross inscribed on the shields of his soldiers; the underdog troupe led by Constantine routed their opponents despite a numeric disadvantage of personnel, artillery, and fortified location. The significance of what unfolded was not lost on the victor.

Subsequently, Constantine granted protection and favours to the Church. As evidenced by the cited proclamation, it is not that he made Christianity the official religion of the Empire, but rather, he ensured that the Catholic Church would be able to carry out her mission without state persecution and harassment. This protection and recognition of fundamental rights proved foundational for the flourishing of Western Civilization. In the often quoted axiom of a need for a "separation of Church and State," the Edict of Milan pinpointed the correct role of government – to allow freedom of worship and not restrict the conscience of its citizens. The cited Edict holds confidence that God would then "show in all things His usual favour and benevolence." How critical it is for civil leaders and citizens to discern truthfully, acknowledge and then materially support the accompanying signs of where and how and to whom Providence is revealing this heavenly favour and goodness. As we head into our federal election vote, the Church has always encouraged weighing the policies of each party that best act consistently with this principle. How tragic when this capacity of discernment is lost.


