

A month in a half deep into the fall semester, the short, simple and wise words from this master of Christian education hopefully come as being helpful and comforting. Obviously, the Covid interruption has impacted the normal proceedings of schooling for students, teachers and parents. Only God can fully appreciate the demanding and stressful balancing act that new health regulations have imposed on all parties. As to the long-term effects on children concerning masking, carrying the burden of infectious fear, mandated isolation, cancelling of so much extra-curricular activities – all must remain vigilant and concerned.

Moreover, for highly engaged Catholic sensibilities, attentiveness is focused on what precisely is being taught to our children through our culture. Irrefutably, there are some very real toxic influences being aimed at our children. Accordingly then, while parents deserve the State to be of assistance in teaching their children proficiency in the standard subjects that are typically outside a parents' competency (i.e. mathematics, science, grammar, literacy), the basics of reasoning, disputation and formation of conscience are best refined on a daily basis within the home.

St. Jean Baptiste de la Salle, (a French version of a St. John Bosco) understood well, in his own day, a collapse of sound Christian education in the struggling and impoverished families around him. He laboured valiantly to offer accessible education to all children, offered by a committed religious community of competent educators. He perceived that any hope at changing a sagging, suffering and sinful society needed to begin with a firm foundation of truth and a genuine love of Christ.

The Cup of Eternal Salvation

This weekend the cup, the chalice, call it what you want, features prominently in our readings. Jesus asks James and John, the sons of Zebedee, "Are you able to drink the cup that I must drink?"

The drinking of the cup of course, an old testament ritual, signifies the expiation of our sins. Christ poured out his blood and drank of the cup on our behalf. And we should all feel a sense of relief and gratefulness when that cop is drunk because the consequences of sin have been expedited. You go to court to be sentenced for your crime and the judge tells you, it's OK. You can go free. You don't have to pay anything that that is the significance of Christ drinking the cup for us.

But in another sense the cup is also the cup of fellowship in which we share. Through sharing the cup, we gain fellowship with Christ and with each other as well, since we are also invited to share each other's burdens. So next time something bad happens in your life and you ask the question, "Lord, why me?" realize that the cup is the answer. It is because he has given you a share in his suffering. Let us accept our sufferings humbly so that God's salvation may be achieved on earth.
