From the brief excerpt of this Victorian two-set thriller, a glimpse into the psychological phenomena of "gaslighting" is gained. In the cited text, Mr. Manningham is seen to question and dismiss the concerns of his spouse as he has just flirted with the couples' young and attractive housekeeper - right in front of her! As the script unfolds, Mr. Manningham escalates the mind games by dimming and brightening the oil lamps so as to wreak havoc on his wife's sense of reality and ignite all kinds of suspicions and self-doubting. His ultimate end is to keep up the trickery and deceptions so as to have his wife committed while plotting along on a wicked get-rich scheme.

The "gaslighting" term has become popular. It is used as a classic illustration of "toxic masculinity". Moreover, it can also being referenced in terms of worldwide governments' handling of the covid-19 narrative. For all the legitimate and sound objections to intrusive public health measures, vaccine mandates, passport identification, targeting of children for inoculation...it appears that the explanations and rules keep changing and shifting. Anyone who voices concerns against the regulations and chooses to speak up for long-standing God-given and civic rights seems to be plunged into the same drama as Mrs. Manningham. If one is inclined towards spooky Halloween stories at this time of year, the plot we have unfolding before us is as disturbing and fearful as they get.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Bartimaeus was a blind man. Due to disease and poor sanitary conditions, blindness was very common in Israel in Bible times. It still is today! Here is a man who has never seen a sunrise or a sunset. He has never seen in the smile on a baby's face. He has never seen the beauty



of God's creation. Bartimaeus lived in a very narrow world. He lived in a world of darkness.

Bartimaeus was not able to go out and find a job. There were no social programs and no welfare programs to help him survive. He was forced to sit beside the road and beg for his living. When the Bible says that he was "*begging*", it means that he constantly begged and asked those passing by to give him money. Bartimaeus lived a life of wretched poverty.

Bartimaeus is a living example of every person who is not in a saving relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. He who is symbolic of all of us. We too are lost, alone, fearful, dependent.

Bartimaeus cries to Jesus and says, "Jesus, son of David, have mercy on me." When Bartimaeus comes to Jesus, Jesus asks him what he wants. Bartimaeus responds in faith and asks for healing. He wants to see and Jesus responds to him.

As soon as Bartimaeus is healed, he starts to follow Jesus. He just begins to go after the Lord. Luke tells us that he, "followed him, glorifying God: and all the people, when they saw it, gave praise to God," <u>Luke 18:43</u>. Bartimaeus received his sight, fell in love with Jesus, began to praise the Lord and became a witness all in a few moments of time.

Are we too prepared to do the same?
