As we enter the month of November and reflect on the mystery of death, the story of Elisabeth Leseur is poignant and moving. This well-educated Parisian woman was married to her husband, Felix. At the time of their wedding she was only nominally practicing her Catholic faith. Felix, who was trained as a medical doctor, confessed that he had renounced his beliefs and embraced atheism. Over the course of their marriage, he began pressuring her to abandon all that she had been taught.

The religious challenge posed to her led her to deepen her understanding of the revelation of Jesus Christ and all that the Church professed. She became so determined to gain her husband's conversion that she offered whatever sufferings for his good. She balanced her study of the faith with a generous involvement of charitable outreach at her parish. Shortly thereafter, she was diagnosed with breast cancer.

On a trip to Lourdes, she received a great grace and mystical understanding that her prayers would be answered in a particular way. She chronicled all her thoughts in a journal.

Upon her death at age 48, her husband discovered her diary. He was so struck to the core of the complete gift of self that his wife offered on his behalf that not only did he seek out a priest for confession, he subsequently entered into the Dominican order and was ordained a priest. Her cause for beatification has been opened.

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Praying for the dead.

2<sup>nd</sup> Maccabees 12.46 records that when soldiers were preparing the bodies of their slain comrades for burial they discovered they were wearing amulets taken from a pagan temple which violated the law of Deuteronomy so they prayed that God would forgive the sin these men had committed.

The New Testament also echoes this notion in the second letter of Timothy when Paul prays for someone who died named Onesiphorus, saying: "May the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church also has something to say about prayers for the dead, stating: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (1030).

At the point of death Catholics have the wonderful tradition of gathering together with family and friends, sometimes at the point of death, around the bedside of the deceased. Prayers would often continue for a period of time up to the point of the funeral mass where prayers are offered for the dead and their family.

I invite us during the month of November to continue this tradition. Let us acknowledge the loving connection we enjoy with the living and the dead, through the mercy of God and the power of the Holy Spirit.

**MONTH OF ALL SOULS - REMEMBERING THE DEAD**

During the month of November, we are called to pray in a particular way for those who have died. We begin the month with the celebration of All Saints Day, November 1st (Mass at 9:15 am & 7:00pm), seeking the intercession of all the Saints who have provided us with such a great witness of faith. On November 2nd (Mass at 9:15 am & 7:00pm), we pray for all who have died, that they may be granted the gift of eternal life. There will be a special Memorial Prayer Box placed in front of the Sanctuary during the month of November. The names of the deceased may be written on the Envelopes provided and placed in the Memorial Prayer Box. During the month of November, the deceased will be remembered at all Masses.



**FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION**

First Friday Adoration, is a Eucharistic adoration held the first Friday of every month in the church. It begins with 9:15 AM Mass and is followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for the remainder of the day. Adoration concludes at 7:00pm followed by Mass.



**WHAT FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION PARTICIPANTS DO:**

Come any time during the adoration hours (approximately 10:00 AM to 6:30 PM) to spend some quiet, prayerful time with Jesus. Adoration participants commit to specific time. These "Guardians of the Eucharist" ensure that the Blessed Sacrament is never left alone.

**FIRST FRIDAY - HOLY HOUR**

Please join us in this holy hour of prayers during the Eucharistic adoration on First Fridays of every month. We start with the 3 O'clock Prayer and the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00pm. Then, we continue with Prayers of Adoration, Thanksgiving, Reparation, and Intercession. We also pray the Eucharistic Rosary and the Litany of the Blessed Sacrament. We end the hour with a hymn of praise and adoration at 4:00pm. All are welcome.
