Pope St. Leo (400-461), feast day, Nov. 10

Born into an aristocratic Tuscan family of influence, Pope Leo was the first to have the title, "the Great" bestowed upon him. Accordingly then, his pontificate was of significance. Like at all times in Church history, division and turbulence marked to social and political climate. Correct doctrine and unity in truth was the proposed remedy. Rather than merely condemning ideological errors and heresies, Pope Leo was known for banishing falsehoods with by presenting dogma in an even more compelling and irresistible manner. In expounding on the divinity of Christ, the Council of Chalcedon, upon reading his work, acclaimed that "in Leo, Peter has spoken!" Moreover, Pope St. Leo was also credited with defending Rome from the pillaging and looting of Germanic tribes.

Consequently, Pope Leo's pontificate added greatly to the prestige of the Holy See. Most of us, as Catholics, expect similarly from the successor of Peter – someone who will win over the masses by eloquence and persuasion and be a steady bulwark against those who attack the Church – someone who will "strengthen/confirm the brethren" in faith. (Lk 22.32) We renew our prayer for Pope Francis in the immensity of his mission.


