The most evident mark of God's anger and the most terrible castigation He can inflict upon the world are manifested when He permits His people to fall into the hands of clerics who are priests more in name than in deed, priests who practice the cruelty of ravening wolves rather than the charity and affection of devoted shepherds. Instead of nourishing those committed to their care, they rend and devour them brutally. Instead of leading their people to God, they drag Christian souls into hell in their train. Instead of being the salt of the earth and the light of the world, they are its innocuous poison and its murky darkness... When God permits such things, it is a very positive proof that He is thoroughly angry with His people and is visiting His most dreadful anger upon them. - St. John Eudes, (1601-1680)

The humble and simple farming background of St. John Eudes, born in the Northern French city of Caen, helped fuel the saint's later zeal and devotion. The accounts of St. John Eudes life describe him trying to assist the poor, the uneducated, and women who had fell into the trap of exploitation and prostitution as a way of earning income. St. John appreciated that there was much work to be done in the reform of how priests were equipped and prepared to confront and work towards the real problems that existed in society and within the Church.

From the searing tone of the cited quote, it sounds like St. John Eudes held nothing back. His words are powerful. Do note the double edged-sword to his indictment! Bad priests are an indication of God's disfavour towards His people. Accordingly then, the punishment is made manifest by the signs of greedy, corrupt, selfish priests who in-turn are a consequence of the overall people they are chosen from. The only apparent remedy is a mutual repentance and conversion of both clergy and Catholic faithful. Failure on either parties' conscientious response exacerbates an already unsustainable, intolerable situation. The French Revolution, just a century later, and with all its accompanying carnage was the ensuing result. St. John Eudes is also known for doing much to promote devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Immaculate Heart of Mary- a true recourse when one knows the time's in which one is living are filled with looming peril.
