The Chronicles of Narnia: The Lion, The Witch and the Wardrobe

In the classic story, made available also in a motion picture, the Father Christmas scene is quite stirring. The young heroes are being hunted by the White Witch and a slew of her evil minions. Thinking they have outwitted their nemeses in a clever hiding place, they are terrified when they sense they have been, once again, detected. Their pursuer advances and they are paralyzed with fear as the steps draw closer with the crunching of snow underfoot. The tension is broken when Father Christmas' radiant warmth bursts forth from the pages/screen. The children become still, relieved and solemn. Not only does Father Christmas come with gifts but with Good News. The Lion, Aslan, is reclaiming Narnia from the infiltrators and enslavers.

The scene conveys eerily and prophetically a people who have forgotten the joy of what it is to celebrate the coming of the King. Aslan, by the unstoppable weight of his majesty, is assembling an army of those willing to join Him in combat to push back the influence of evil that has, for far too long, gripped and strangled a people who were meant to live in confidence, faith, freedom and love. In the novel, C.S. Lewis had as his setting an England in the midst of WW2 - valiantly pushing forward with all its drama of bravery and gloom; undoubtedly, that call to courage and the fight against faithless misery has spread and carried over to a battle on the spiritual front - to all parts of the world. Where the temptation to despair and bitterness is real, let us remember that He has come and once again, He is on the move. Long live Aslan!

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family. The multiple Lectionary reading options highlight different aspects of conception, parenting, marriage and family. The readings from 1 Samuel, Psalm 84, and 1 John are recommended.



The second reading from 1 John builds on the first reading by emphasizing the power of prayer and the interrelationship among all humans. This emphasis is more fitting for the feast of the Holy Family.

In 1 John, we have an image of God as a loving father. Multiple times, we are reminded that we are all children of God. By extension, we are all united as a human family, created by a God who loves, listens and answers prayers. This reading shows the range of what it means to be family, pushing us to look beyond mere biological connection to see ourselves in relationship with all people.

The Gospel reading is another uniquely Lukan story. This narrative focuses on Jesus as a preteen traveling to Jerusalem to celebrate Passover. Although he goes with his parents, he finds himself studying and learning from teachers in the Temple. He learns from them, and they are impressed with his understanding. While Mary and Joseph worry when they are unable to locate Jesus, the Holy Family eventually reunites. The end of the story says that Jesus was obedient to them and continued to increase in wisdom and divine and human favor.

Jesus' interaction with his parents, his Father in heaven and his community show the range of familial connections that Jesus had in his life. Jesus learns and grows with his parents and with his teachers at the temple. While the Gospels record accounts of Jesus not being accepted by his family and hometown, Luke's account today offers a tradition of Jesus thriving in his community at a young age.

It is all a beautiful testament to the depth and uniqueness of this thing we call Family. And today we celebrate family life in all its abundance and shades of meaning. May God bless us all.
