#### PARISH MISSION



- "Do vou love my Son?" -"Yes!," the girl exclaimed. -"Do you love me?" - "Oh, ves!" "Then sacrifice yourself for me." - Our Lady of Beauraing to 15 year-old visionary, Fernande Voisin, (Nov. 29, 1932 – Jan. 3, 1933) At the start this 2022 year, and its dedication to the Solemnity of the Motherhood of God, it is good to draw attention to a series of intriguing, yet relatively unknown, apparitions took place in a small village on the south-east region of Belgium, bordering France. With a Europe dealing with the aftermath of the Great War and a world gripped by the Great Depression, Our Blessed Mother appeared to 5 children in the front yard of a local boarding school. The typical phenomena of any apparition began to unfold: skepticism from the children's parents, hostility from the socialist government, cold indifference by the local clergy, the curiosity of a townspeople left wondering who to believe. As the tensions and conflicts played out, the remarkable change of the children drew amazement. Their attitude shifted from a non-practicing Catholic family background to young, fervent believers who were content and willing to endure all the scrutiny, pressure, and ridicule. Their confidence peaked when the Lady acknowledged herself to be the Immaculate Mother and revealed her heart as glowing with a golden and intense radiance. As if preparing the children, and all those who would pay heed to the apparition of further tribulation to come, the brief cited exchange is the extent of the message she shared. In the midst of the horror of WW2, the local Belgian Bishop, in agreement with the Holy See, authenticated the apparitions, in 1943, on account of the numerous pilgrimages and conversions he saw flourishing at the site. As we take in this wonderful season and as we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, the visit of the wise men. Let us open our hearts with generousity and joy as the wise men did. As the song says, let's "repeat the song in joy" all through the year.
