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"I am the Virgin of the Poor...Believe in me and I will believe in you. Pray very, very much."

-Our Lady of Banneaux, January 1933

Weeks after a series of apparitions at Beauraing, just 100 km further north east of that town, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared outside the home of an 11 year-old girl, Marriette Beco. This impoverished and barely on the map farm land village of Banneux, Belgium would go on to be an important little shrine of pilgrimage and conversion. At that time, the Beco family, which included 8 other children, were embittered with the harsh miseries of life; moreover, they had given up on the practice of their Catholic faith. The visionary, Marriette, had ceased attending her First Communion catechism classes; she was regarded as the least interested and informed of all the students. Nonetheless, in the dead cold of winter, Marriette, while keeping watch for the return of one of her brothers, noticed in the dark of evening, a beautiful lady beckoning her to come outside to join her in prayer. Again, the same phenomena of her immovable and beaming testimony was to stand in contrast against the incredulity of parents, siblings, parish priest, and local villagers. Eventually, the complete change of her formerly indifferent and disinterested attitude towards faith was compelling enough for her father to be moved from hostility towards God to asking the parish priest to hear a general confession of the sins of his life.

At the start of the 2022 year, the title of "Virgin of the Poor" is notable. The Belgium of her day was marked by the after-effects of the Great War with its loss of a generation of young men, runaway inflation from its neighbouring Germany, and widespread economic depression. In listening to the sobering prognostications for our coming year, with the same gloomy talk of rising interest rates, escalating cost of groceries and cost of living, threats to supply chains, job loss on account of unjustifiable vaccine mandates – the consolation of Our Blessed Mother to strengthen and comfort us through austere times is to be acknowledged. Her admonition to pray, pray, pray very much is to be on the top of our list of healthy new year's resolutions.

Over the past few weeks we have had several feast days, Christmas, of course, New Year's Day(the feast of the motherhood of Mary), followed by the feast of the Epiphany. Now, this weekend, the feast of the Baptism of Jesus is upon us.



The Feast of the Baptism of Jesus allows us to reflect a bit on this very important sacrament, particularly in terms of our own baptism. The church considers baptism as the basis of our Christian life and the gateway to the other sacraments. This is where it all begins.

There was a time when all three sacraments of initiation, Baptism, First communion and Confirmation were received on the same day, with the understanding that through Baptism you were incorporated into the life of the church and First Communion and Confirmation allowed one to participate in the mission of the church.

So all three sacraments were well connected. Baptism was like your ticket or registration to enter the race and first communion and confirmation allowed you to run a good race. My suspicion is that most Catholics do not make the connection between initiation and mission. Baptism for many remains a static event devoid of purpose.

This weekend I invite us to renew our Baptismal promises not only in terms of our identity as members of the church but also in terms of our calling to live out the gospel in today's world and to be a sign of God love to those around us.

WORSHIPSAFE PROTOCOLS Provincial Announcement -January 4, 2022 -Latest Covid-19 Updates





The provincial government announced that Ontario will be moving to a modi-

fied Step 2 of the Roadmap to Reopening. These changes will take effect as of Wednesday, January 5, 2022, with most restrictions lasting a minimum of 21 days.

- Capacity restrictions for places of worship are set at 50% of pre-Covid capacity. Regarding spiritual services and activities held on church property, physical distancing of two metres (six feet) remains at this time unless members are from the same household. (We are limited to 70 designated spots within the sanctuary)
- By-laws remain in place requiring the use of a face mask in public spaces indoors and hand sanitising upon entering.
- If you are sick and or experiencing any of the following symp-. toms: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, recent loss of taste or smell, soar throat, congestion, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea; please do not attend to church and contact your health care provider.
