I charge thee, before God and Jesus Christ, who shall judge the living and the dead, by his coming, and his kingdom: Preach the word: be instant in season, out of season: reprove, entreat, rebuke in all patience and doctrine. For there shall be a time, when they will not endure sound doctrine; but, according to their own desires, they will heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears: And will indeed turn away their hearing from the truth, but will be turned unto fables. -2 Timothy 4.1-4

This coming week, the Church celebrates the Feasts of the Conversion of St. Paul (Jan 25) and Sts. Timothy and Titus (Jan 26). From his avowed determination to eradicate the upstart Christian Church, Saul of Tarsus' encounter with the Risen Lord forever changed the fiercely zealous Pharisee into the great apostle to the Gentiles who would go on to "suffer much for the sake of My name." (Acts 9.16) The younger protégés, Timothy and Titus, would benefit from the words of encouragement from the battle-tested Paul. Paul's legacy of shipwrecks, beatings, stoning, banishment, and imprisonments would help fuel the fire of the younger mentors so that they in turn could face courageously all the opposition that awaits those who are called to advance the Gospel. These early pillars of the faith are to be most admired, not only for the physical and moral hardships they were found willing to endure, but because they held within them, "a daily pressure because of my anxiety for all the churches."(2 Cor 11.28)

There is widespread commentary about the questionable willingness of our modern pastors to echo any of the boldness of their ancestors. It is bizarre when the shepherds of the Church are more in sync and comfortable with the message of the world, rather than preaching a message of rebuke towards those whom we know are not willing to endure sound doctrine. How fortunate and blessed we are when the prayerful vigilance of those entrusted with the mission of preaching are able to identify and articulate a course of action that diverts us from further disaster. For those who are convicted enough to sound the alarm and put themselves in harm's way, like as in times former, we pledge our fidelity and support.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Unpacking the Creed: "the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth"



This simple statement affirms in carefully which chosen words our Catholic understanding of God as loving father. It implies specific qualities such as nurturing, affirming, instructing, guiding, and providing. But it also indicates a certain intimacy and the constant attention that a good father provides. It is significant that the words father and almighty follow each other, making a link between God's fatherly care and the power and might he exercises over all creation (heaven and earth). In our Catholic approach God does not exercise this power arbitrarily or in a forceful way, but as a loving father who delights in his children and who has compassion on them. It is a radical departure from the vengeful and aloof god portrayed in several cultures.

WORSHIPSAFE PROTOCOLS Provincial Announcement -

January 4, 2022 - Latest Covid-19 Updates The provincial government announced that Ontario will be moving to a modified Step 2 of the Roadmap to Reopening. These changes will take effect as of Wednesday, January 5,

2022, with most restrictions lasting a minimum of 21 days.

- Capacity restrictions for places of worship are set at 50% of pre-Covid capacity. Regarding spiritual services and activities held on church property, physical distancing of two metres (six feet) remains at this time unless members are from the same household. (We are limited to 70 designated spots within the sanctuary)
- By-laws remain in place requiring the use of a face mask in public spaces indoors and hand sanitising upon entering.
- If you are sick and or experiencing any of the following symptoms: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, recent loss of taste or smell, soar throat, congestion, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea; please do not attend to church and contact your health care provider.
