As soon as the Word appears after many vigils and endless prayers, long works and torrents of tears, he escapes all of a sudden, just when you thought that you could securely possess him. At another time, he will come close to the one who weeps and runs after him; he lets himself be possessed for a while, but not to be kept forever, for just a moment later, he flees and escapes.

St. Bernard (1090-1153), Sermon on the Canticle of Canticles

On this second Sunday of Lent, as the Liturgy invites us to contemplate the scene on top of Mt. Tabor, this quote from St. Bernard of Clairvaux is most suitable. Just as the select three apostles are given a momentary glimpse of the glory to come, St. Bernard explains that our own spiritual lives will be marked with peak times of divine intimate consolation, inevitably yielding to a return to dryness and darkness. We have little practical connection to the life and times of a St. Bernard; he was a Cistercian monk, abbot, papal consultor, and preacher of the second crusade. Yet, any attentiveness to our Lenten penitential observance can note the spiritual movements of which he speaks - longed-after illumination/confounding silence and distancing. Most notably, St. Bernard, referred to as the mellifluous doctor, was writing predominantly to men in monasteries. His writings encourage men to appreciate the mystery of their spousal relationship with Jesus as members of the Church, Bride of Christ. Only the spiritually receptive and mature can appreciate the subtleties inherent in such a proposal. Moreover, St. Bernard was intensely passionate in fostering a love for the Blessed Virgin Mary in the men entrusted to his paternal care. These same foundational spiritual counsels and dynamics are essential in our own day.

# **UNPACKING THE CREED**

"and by the Holy Spirit, was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man. For our sake, he was crucified under Pontius Pilate."

To refute the Gnostic claim that God had not taken on either human nature or a human body, the creed affirms that Jesus was born from a physical body of a virgin, he is seen as having his dual nature of Divinity and Humanity from his first moment of life. Note as well the role of Mary who cooperates in the work of the incarnation; she is an active participant in bringing God into the world.

There were many stories in the time of Jesus of mythical figures who performed miracles, who died and rose from the dead. To mention that Jesus died "under Pontius Pilate" a Roman prefect from 26-32 C.E. makes his death a historical event and takes it out of the realm of mythology.
