While we watch attentively to unfolding events, we are at least left reassured that any participation with sin and deception, on our part, is strongly renounced. May the power of His victory confound those who oppose Him.

America magazine reports that: "One of the least discussed but most concrete qualities of Catholic worship is that it is, generally speaking, short. On any given Sunday most Catholics can expect to be walking out of the church less than an hour after they entered."

"There are some parishes—those with particularly enthusiastic choirs or homilists, or a particularly lengthy list of announcements—that might run closer to an hour and a half. But even the most action-packed Sunday Mass does not rival the many Protestant Christian denominations that gather for three or four hours." All of that is about to change. Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil will take us well past the Catholic threshold. And it is all for our good as we recount the dramatic events that occurred at the end of Jesus' life.

But it is the Easter Vigil that takes the cake so to speak. It begins after nightfall as all good mysteries do. Then we are confronted with a blazing fire that has to be blessed. Nails are then pressed into this humungous candle that represents Jesus as the light of the world. A candle much bigger than any we use in the church.

Ah it's all truly amazing. After you have covered all of salvation history, you will get to see new people entering the church. Adults are baptized and confirmed. They receive their first Eucharist.

You will experience the Alleluia and the Litany and realise that all of us as Catholics are in this together. We have all signed up for the experience. So let us rejoice indeed that Jesus has risen indeed as he said he would. Happy and Holy Easter!
