A.W. Tozer (1897-1963), Evangelical Preacher

Born in Pennsylvania into poor circumstances, the young Aiden Wilson Tozer's life was changed upon hearing a street preacher call passing pedestrians to conversion and salvation in Jesus Christ. For anyone who has experienced such soap-box evangelization, the spectacle can exude a sense of awkwardness and fanaticism. However, for the 17 year old Aiden, the reaction was different. In the circumstances of his life, he had never really heard the gospel proclaimed with boldness. The novelty and conviction of the street preacher sparked him to immerse himself in Scripture and Christian studies. Moreover, his faith growing faith in Jesus Christ propelled him to taking up the ministry of preaching. He had no background in formal education, he was of slight stature and modest looks, he was not particularly gifted in public speaking but, as the cited quotes suggest, he knew the difference between worship and entertainment. He understood the distinction between the leading people in worship vs trying to be a "showman". He started off with just the smallest of congregations in south Chicago, to radio broadcasts, to accepting an assignment to the Avenue Road Alliance Church in Toronto. On this second Sunday of Easter, as the Apostles come to startling recognition of the One who is with them in their midst in the upper room, we too beg the grace, in all our Churches, that our time of worship be noted for their right sense of reverence.
