¡ARGENTINA! ¡ARGENTINA, CANTA Y CAMINA! - Prayer to Our Lady of Lujan, Argentina

On this day, May 8, the country of Argentina honours our Blessed Mother under the title of Our Lady of Lujan. It is a national feast with roots that go back to the earliest colonial efforts at settlement. When a peasant farmer intended to build a chapel in the farming and vine-rich land of the Cordoba region, he wanted a statue of our Blessed Mother to guide him in his successful venture. He ordered a statue from a friend merchant in Brazil. The merchant sent two small terracotta statues to provide an option of preference. When the caravan carrying the statues left Buenos Aires for the Western part of the sprawling country, about 65 km outside the city, the ox led cart carrying the statue would not budge. It was only once one of the statues was removed did the ox continue their hauling. Those in the procession understood that the statue causing the ox's defiance was to remain in the small town of Lujan. Argentina is approaching the 400^{th} anniversary of the historical event, (the year 1630). Over the ensuing centuries, the small original chapel has expanded to an impressive shrine, with several awe-inspiring phenomena and miracles attributed to devotion of Our Blessed Mother under this particular cherished title.

FLORES DE MAYO ("FLOWERS OF MAY")



May is the month when we highlight the unconditional love and devotion of all Mothers - be they moms, grandmas, step moms, moms-to-be, wishing-to-be moms, etc. (Mother's Day falls on May 8th). The Catholic Women's League of St. Marguerite d'Youville Parish is organizing a fundraising project -Flores de Mayo ("Flowers of May") ultimately dedi-

cated to the Queen and Mother of us all, our Mama Mary. Flores de Mayo is a traditional procession around our church vicinity participated in by all the amazing women of our parish dressed in their fine pageant gowns, side by side with children ages 4 to 12 in full white regalia holding flower offerings (First Communicants included). The procession begins in the main church with devotional prayers. Marian songs are played once Mama Mary's carriage commences the journey and exits the main church to specified routes within the church's parking lot. The mysteries of the most holy rosary are also recited. The procession returns to the main church and ends with each child offering flowers at the foot of our Lady's carriage. The climax of the event is the Crowning of Mama Mary as Oueen of heaven and earth.
