

Elena Gorokhova (1955-), Russian/American Author of, "A Mountain of Crumbs"

The cited quote is being shared and echoed among many Catholic commentators as an inference to the troubling times in which we live; additionally, Elena's insight from her days of growing up in Leningrad/St. Petersburg serves as a searing indictment of the major institutions that direct our current social structure. In her works and in her interviews. Elena recalls what life was like under Communist rule. From her recollections, she speaks of the banality and stagnation of the Soviet system. Her parents' generation, who experienced first hand the upheaval of the Bolshevik revolution, knew the traumatic consequences of failed adherence to party loyalty. The ensuing decades of the 1960's and 70's failed to provide the fruition of the ideal, utopian "golden age". Morale was low, supplies were always deficient, opportunities of advancement were scarce, yet the appearance of compliance was maintained for fear of acting contrarily. Elena seemed to have received little religious instruction or faith exposure in her childhood. When she was 10 years of age, her father died. He had been hospitalized from a work-related accident. Owning no phone, they went to a public phone to check on his status. The nurses informed them coldly, matter-of-factly of his death. Elena, her mother, and sister returned to their apartment with neither of them knowing how to process the experience of the loss of a loved one. Stoic despondency and muffled feelings were encouraged. And so, the success of her book is attributed to how bleak and dreary society can become when eliminating the worship of God from its collective experi-CC Ponder ence.

did not hang around but entrusted his ministry to the Church through the guidance of the Holy Spirit.


