

The description of the sense of awe, confusion, marvel, and despondency that marks the account of Our Lord's Ascension in Acts mirrors our own mixture of emotions when confronting the death of a loved one. Naturally, we cling with profound gratitude to all the memories of laughter, intimacy, vulnerability, and comfort shared with the one we have lost. And yet, who of us can not appreciate that when someone who was so central to all the treasured good times is no longer among us, the heartsickness of mourning and painful loss sorely needs to be faced? With two months passing from the death of celebrated drummer, Taylor Hawkins, the cultural world of artists, composers, fans, and festival-goers was rightfully shaken. Taylor was widely admired and liked for his pleasant and genuinely positive disposition. Whether the untimely cause of death for the 50year old was the wear-and-tear ravages of a rock-n-roll lifestyle or unmentionable vaccine related heart complications, the somber fact of death is forced upon a typically secular people inclined more towards exalting revelry and success over sacredly revealed truths. Accordingly then, there is great need to help a confused and bewildered world find good news, beyond the harsh realities of sadness and grief, in Jesus' victory over death, his return to the Father, and his sending us on mission to be witnesses to this saving promise. It helps to lead those in distress when, already embedded in their own recorded words, lies the deepest answer to the desires of their heart.

The readings this weekend have a distinct "not yet" tone. In the first reading from Acts Luke speaks of the apostles having to wait "for the promise of the father." The responsorial psalm an-



nounces that "God has gone up with a shout" as if to prepare something which is to come. In the second reading from Hebrews Paul speaks of those "eagerly waiting for him" and in the gospel reading Jesus addresses the apostles and tells them that "repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed to all nations."

Everything is forward looking, there is expectation and hope that something eventful is about to occur. We know of course that it is the coming of the Holy Spirit in the Pentecost event which will culminate God's plan of salvation. Jesus goes up and the Holy Spirit comes down.

Luke puts it nicely when he mentions that "Jesus withdrew from them." The "them" of course is not only the apostles but all of us. Jesus is no longer available to us as he was before. It is not the Holy Spirit now who will empower us to continue God's work.
