On the Solemnity of Pentecost, we celebrate the great infusion of the Holy Spirit into the Church and the dynamic transformation of her members from timidity to audaciousness. The mystery of the spiritual battle of which the Church is engaged spans the time of the Apostles to present day. In expanding the analogy of combat and conflict, one helpful metaphor to lead us into assuming our own heroic part is for those enlisted to recognize the seriousness of the dangerous yet heroic mission to which we have been conscripted. For many of us, life in the Church is ideally envisioned as being on a luxury cruise ship. It is hard to break from the temptation to desire a Church that serves up all the easy-going, relaxed, enjoyable comforts as offered by the cruise liner industry: a vast array of food, music, entertainment selections to cater to personal preference, new people to meet and mingle with, and exciting, exotic harbours waiting to be explored. By contrast, the understanding of the Church as a battle ship more aptly matches the reality of what our deployment signifies. Finding the resolve to take up our particularly assigned, highly essential role, and work cohesively as a organized battle unit so as to prevent the enemy from winning requires us to asses the high priority of what is at stake. The cited quote simply focuses intentions and motivations. While any military connotation rightfully should strike us as unpalatable, a valiantly summoned struggle is the only way to fend off repulsive terms from being imposed on those we are called to protect.

attend Mass for a grave reason, including a great vulnerability to COVID-19 or because they are self-isolating to limit the spread of illness, then they are excused from their Sunday obligation, as the law of the Church allows.

After two years of COVID-19 restrictions, many have been deprived of the opportunity to attend Mass and to receive the most Holy Eucharist and all of us have missed the opportunity to experience community, including members of our parishes. As we come to the celebration of Pentecost this weekend, we invite and encourage the faithful to return to the practice of attending Mass in-person.
