We are called to live as citizens of the New Jerusalem, long before we finally enter the heavenly city. It is not for us to build heaven on earth, and attempts to do that have often produced more hell than heaven, but we know the standard that must guide us during our brief earthly journey, one rooted in the order established by God and found not only in divine revelation but also in the very structure and texture of nature. The cited words derive from the then newly appointed Archbishop at his Mass of Installation at St. Michael's cathedral. In retrospect, his preaching on basic Catholic truths appear to have unfolded in compellingly prophetic manner during his time as Chief Shepherd for the diocese entrusted to his care. From his good and modest upbringing from the town of Guelph, his keen gifts for study were noted in his ability to earn several academic degrees. The more scholarly inclined and mild-mannered priest was put to the test by being summoned to leadership roles in the Church. From rector of St. Peter's seminary in London, Bishop of Edmonton, to Archbishop of Toronto and Cardinal of the Church, each of us ought to appreciate what it must be like to be thrust into positions of authority that are not necessarily suited to our temperament. When virtues of meekness and humility are mistaken by others as signs of weakness, it leaves others thinking that one can be taken advantage of by power-plays of aggression. Irrefutably, society/culture have tried to hasten a restructured world without reference to God under his watch. Sincere efforts, on his behalf, at instruction and correction have seemingly been all too easily ignored and dismissed. In reference to this Trinity Sunday, Cardinal Collins has often repeated during his tenure, that it is hard to reach the goal of where one is going if one does not know the correct destination. As his retirement from administrative responsibility draws near we ought to appreciate that we all share in the judgement and fate of assessing where we stand and what is to come. CC Ponder

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Our scripture writers wax poetic this weekend. We are taken on a grand tour. The first reading from Proverbs establishes the presence of the Holy Spirit "at the beginning of His work," craft-



ing all creation and turning it into something in which we can delight.

The Psalm continues along this trend with the refrain "O Lord, our God, how majestic is your name in all the earth." All creation reflects God's glory with the psalmist praising God for establishing man as the height of God's creation.

The second reading from Romans that most theological of Paul's writings invites us to share in "the glory of God" through suffering, since suffering brings about endurance and endurance produces character and hope and hope does not disappoint us.

#### SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION

Given that most of the health and safety restrictions in our parishes are no longer in place and the faithful are able to attend the celebration of the Eucharist once again, the basis for the dispensation from the Sunday obligation has dissipated and is no longer in effect.

The Church does not obligate people to do the impossible. If individuals, based on their conscience, cannot attend Mass for a grave reason, including a great vulnerability to COVID-19 or because they are self-isolating to limit the spread of illness, then they are excused from their Sunday obligation, as the law of the Church allows.

After two years of COVID-19 restrictions, many have been deprived of the opportunity to attend Mass and to receive the most Holy Eucharist and all of us have missed the opportunity to experience community, including members of our parishes. As we come to the celebration of Pentecost this weekend, we invite and encourage the faithful to return to the practice of attending Mass in-person.
