In preparation for the Blessed Virgin Mary's Fatima visit to the three shepherd children, an angel provided instruction on three separate occasions. In retrospect, Lucia, Jacinta and Francisco would describe the angelic apparitions as so intense and intimate, that they did not ever think of mentioning it to anyone else nor discussing it among themselves. On this Corpus Christi Sunday, this prescribed prayer of reparation towards all the Eucharistic indignities and unholy receptions ought to jolt and shake us. If our Lord was pained by the dishonourable treatment of the gift of the Blessed Sacrament then, sadly, how much greater the desecration of our own day? Moreover, the prayer is quite similar in wording and tone as that which Jesus taught St. Faustina of the Divine Mercy to pray, "Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity our your dearly Beloved Son..." Where much debate and division exists in the Church as to the proper disciplining of manifest public sinners who hold and promote policies that violate and show contempt to all that is sacred, it is hard to ignore what heaven has said on the matter. Backed by Scripture, Tradition and Canon Law, the denying of holy communion to those who profane its sanctity by their unworthy reception ought to be seen as an act of concern and charity rather than an intended insult towards those indicted.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Some amazing stuff this weekend. The high priest Jesus Christ himself, a priest of the order of Melchizedek feeds us in "the deserted place" of our earthly exile. He takes the bread, breaks it



and gives it to the twelve, commanding them to feed the crowd.

In the first reading the blessing of Abram by the priest Melchizedek and the subsequent celebration with bread and wine, prefigures the Eucharist. It is the daily miracle of the heavenly high priest of Jesus. Giving himself to us, so we may proclaim his victory of death.

What the Eucharist tells us in no uncertain terms is that God will provide. In every circumstance we will not be left wanting. The linking of the Eucharist with the manna event in the Old Testament further brings to the fore the issue of trust. The Israelites had to trust that on a daily basis food would be provided. If they tried to save some for the next day it would spoil.

SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION

Given that most of the health and safety restrictions in our parishes are no longer in place and the faithful are able to attend the celebration of the Eucharist once again, the basis for the dispensation from the Sunday obligation has dissipated and is no longer in effect.

The Church does not obligate people to do the impossible. If individuals, based on their conscience, cannot attend Mass for a grave reason, including a great vulnerability to COVID-19 or because they are self-isolating to limit the spread of illness, then they are excused from their Sunday obligation, as the law of the Church allows.

After two years of COVID-19 restrictions, many have been deprived of the opportunity to attend Mass and to receive the most Holy Eucharist and all of us have missed the opportunity to experience community, including members of our parishes. As we come to the celebration of Pentecost this weekend, we invite and encourage the faithful to return to the practice of attending Mass in-person.

ShareLife agencies need your support, now more than ever


