Those who attack me today because I speak about politics and the health emergency, yesterday attacked me because I denounced corruption in the Church and the deviations of the Council and the reformed liturgy. The "sectorization" of competencies is an excellent tool with which the adversary decides, motu proprio [with his own hand], what his interlocutor is authorized to say, when he can say it, and what qualifications he must have in order to open his mouth. Who exactly has decided that a Bishop may not intervene in political matters? Secularists and, among Catholics, those who curiously allow ultra-progressive bishops and clergy to ramble on, who swoon if Bergoglio speaks against Trump or in favor or Trudeau, but who tear their garments if a bishop does not please the system or does not follow the narrative in a way that is unified with the aligned thinking.

The cited words were drawn from a recent interview where the Archbishop was asked to respond to his controversial interventions into the world of Church affairs and world politics. Whether his bold statements have come to the attention of the average parishioner or not does not negate the wider and shocking impact that his words have had on the current discourse among high-ranking prelates. Archbishop Vigano comes from a classically trained Italian background in canon law, diplomacy, and ecclesial administration. While one time highly regarded for his service to the Church, the cited statement illustrates the ongoing and virulent campaign of discrediting his character. It was Archbishop Vigano, while serving as the Apostolic Nuncio (Ambassador) to the United States who noted the deep problems within the Bishops ranks as he disclosed the entrenched filth of Cardinal Theodore McCarrick and the corrupt individuals who collaborated with and were promoted by the disgraced clergymen. As we celebrate the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul (June 29), it is reassuring to know that there are some bishops with integrity who have a reverent and holy fear of God and recognize the significance of their responsibilities and the impending time of the judgment.
