While summer time presents numerous diversions and prevent most of us from staying on top of trending events, it would be no surprise if the plight of Catholics in north-

ern and central Nigeria was completely unfamiliar among western audiences on account of the widespread silence concerning this crisis. News media outlets all but ignore the subject. Islamist extremist groups under the names Boko Haram and Fulani herdsmen militants carry out atrocities. In a crossfire of competition for land rights, natural resources, and religious supremacy, Christian farmers face an onslaught of kidnapping, arson, and terrorism. Thousands have disappeared and have been murdered. To their heroic credit, Catholic priests, who potentially fetch a greater ransom, are most marked as prize targets. They are doing their best to remain and suffer with their own. The state governments aligned with Islamic goals consistently fail to offer protection or retribution. Furthermore, when compelled to flee and migrate to other countries, the Christian exiles predictably find themselves trapped in the web of despicable human trafficking schemes. Allegedly well-meaning benefactors groom the cashstrapped refugees for further exploitation and indentured service. The Church in Nigeria is increasingly becoming a Church of martyrs where little relief appears to be on the horizon.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Good day, everyone. The focus of our readings this weekend is on the theme of stewardship, managing the things that God has given to us. And believe you me, God has entrusted something to offer all of us, as small and insignificant as it might be.



The reference passage when you talk about stewardship is the very first book of the Bible, the book of Genesis, particu-

larly chapter one, verse 26 and chapter two, verse 15, where we are told that God said, let us make man in our own image and let them rule over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, over the livestock, and over all the earth.

Everything that makes up reality has been entrusted to us, everything that is good. But we all know that stewardship is one of the most misunderstood words in the Bible. Most people think that it refers to money or to giving your collection on a Sunday, but it is not at all a financial program.

It is the most misunderstood word yet. Still, it is the second most popular theme throughout the entire Bible. Over half of the parables, including our reading this weekend, is all about stewardship.

The key to understanding what stewardship is all about occurs in verse 16 of our gospel reading this weekend, where it is mentioned that the master commended the dishonest steward for acting prudently. That gives a clue as to how we are to conduct our affairs.

As good stewards, we are to be prudent, and it probably begins with how we manage a basic thing as our time. I want to focus on the aspect of time in terms of our stewardship this weekend. Time is a very valuable commodity to be treasured. It is non-renewable and non-transferable. Treasure every moment that you have, because when you lose it said, it's gone. How do you use your time? Do you give significant people in your life the time that they deserve? Or are we always in a rush? Do we put aside the cell phone and social media when necessary?

Let us pray this weekend for the ability to be good stewards. God Bless
