

If the Church enjoyed peace all the time without any persecution, it would be very abnormal. It would be a reason for us to worry and examine ourselves lest anything was going wrong. Perhaps we were not living as faithful disciples of Christ? As persecution must be expected, it comes as a special sign of the Church and we should not try to make compromises or concessions of any kind in order to bring the persecution to an end quickly. We ourselves cannot take the initiative to create or arouse persecution. But if it comes to us one day, not only should we accept it readily from the hand of God but we should even rejoice and be glad. As the Acts of the Apostles records, ."... after they were beaten, the apostles left the Council, full of joy that God had considered them worthy to suffer disgrace for the name of Jesus." (Acts 1:41)

- His Eminence, Ignatius Cardinal Kung Pin-Mei (1901-1999), from a June 30, 1991 homily preached in Rome right after he was elevated as a Cardinal

As the mock show trial of the courageous emeritus Joseph Cardinal Zen of Hong Kong unfolds, the noble prelate knows that he is upholding a most valiant heritage. Defying the current repressive restrictions on free speech and practice of Christian faith, the 90-year old Cardinal Zen knows that the anticipation of his final judgment far outweighs whatever intimidation felt by his current tribunal embroilment. His intention and concern is to help sustain the faith for the suffering, underground, persecuted Catholic Church in China. He is continuing in the legacy of this relatively unknown hero of our Church, Cardinal Kung. From a devotional webpage promoting his memory and cause for beatification, the following brief background highlights the sacrifice that was asked of him.

Born in Shanghai, China, Ignatius Kung Pin-Mei was ordained to the priesthood in 1930. He was named the first Bishop of Soochow by Pope Pius XII in 1949, only months after the People's Liberation Army marched into Shanghai. In 1950, he was named the first Chinese Bishop of Shanghai. Bishop Kung was arrested on September 8, 1955 for his steadfast loyalty to the Catholic Church and to the Successor of St. Peter, and was sentenced by the Communist Party to life in prison. In 1979, Blessed Pope John Paul II secretly [in pectore] named Bishop Kung a Cardinal. After 33 years' imprisonment, Cardinal Kung was released, and placed under house arrest so that his communications could be strictly monitored. Seeing as how his influence and inspiration was only growing for the 3 million plus Chinese Catholics and not wanting to further make a martyr out of him, he was exiled from China in 1988. Pope John Paul II wept when the 90 year Cardinal Kung knelt to receive his red hat as a sign of the underground persecuted Chinese Catholics' fidelity to the Holy See.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It is often said that the opposite of Love is not hate, but indifference. This comes out clearly in this weekend's readings. In the first reading from Amos the rich and powerful are visited with woe



not for their wealth but for their refusal to share it; not for their power, but for their indifference to the plight of the poor. The rich man in today's gospel also feasts on fine wines and dresses in royal purple completely oblivious to the suffering around him. The liturgy today is a call to repentance. Notice that the readings mention the names of the poor-Lazarus and Joseph-while the rich have no name.

And in this Eucharist we have a foretaste of the love that will be ours in the next life—when He will raise the lowly to the heavenly banquet with Abraham and the prophets (see Luke 13:28), where we too will rest our heads on the bosom of our Lord.
