If even only slightly interested in the distant rumble of liturgical battles being contested in the wider Church, drawing attention to some of the significant alterations between the pre-Vatican II mass vs what we have become habitually accustomed to provides some meaningful insight. If there was any major glaring change of before and after, most commentaries point towards the complete revision of wording in the offertory prayers. In the TLM there is a clear and emphatic focus on the priest's preparation to offer the atoning sacrifice of Jesus Christ for both the living and the dead. By contrast, they have been replaced by a modified version of a blessing used at a Jewish table grace before meals prayer: "Blessed are You, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread/wine we offer you fruit of the earth/vine, work of human hands. It will become for us the bread of life/ spiritual drink." Rather than accentuating the nature of sacrifice, the new version focuses on an act of presenting and exchanging of gifts: bread and wine to God, spiritual food and drink to man in return.

For decades, bishops and clergy have expressed their legitimate concern over the decline in faith by a significant percentage of Catholics regarding knowledge of Christ's true presence in the Blessed Sacrament. Acknowledged reasons for this decline have been cited as everything from the impoverishment of proper catechesis, politicians who receive communion regardless of their public defiance to Church teaching, parishes that were forced into lock-down even though the Eucharist is recognized as being vital to Christian life. For all that cannot be simply changed or reversed, perhaps one way to really make a deep impression upon the faithful, that communicates in word and action of the Eucharist's sacred nature, is to have priests pray at the altar in the tone and manner previously prescribed. On a Thanksgiving weekend, we are all to acknowledge our gratitude to God. How much more powerful to do so in the comparable way provided in the cited verses. It is one thing to say thank you; it is another to explicitly confess oneself a sinner, who despite one's admitted unworthiness, is the undeserving and blessed beneficiary of in incalculable, infinite treasure. Surely, most of us would appreciate our priestly fathers publicly professing that kind of honesty and humility as a model of right worship.

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It's interesting that in the gospel reading this weekend, the story of the ten cleansed lepers, the word used for "giving thanks" is the same word for Eucharist. The writer of this story puts a Eucharistic twist on this event.



From this perspective we realise two things; first that our Eucharistic sacrifice is our primary means of offering thanks to God for all his favors. We gather as church to acknowledge God's blessings collectively. But also that the gift of faith is extended to all. It is the Samaritan and not the Israelite who returns to offer thanks. The mass offers us the wonderful opportunity to fall on our knees

and offer thanks, and through this act we are cleansed and renewed.

Another dimension to the story is the fact that this Samaritan is the only person in the New Testament who offers thanks to Jesus personally. Is this an indication that often our work as church workers goes un-noticed? Whether or not this is the case we know that God is aware of all our good deeds and it is to him that we look for our justification.
