

O God, You gave the Virgins consecrated to You under the leadership of Ursula, the courage of their wonderful combat, so that by the victory of martyrdom they arrived at the glory of the Beatific Vision; grant, we beseech You, that we may be helped by those whom You have enabled on this day to pass from mortal combat to triumph in heaven. Amen.

- Opening Prayer for Feast of Sts Ursula and Companions, Oct 21, Roman Missal, 1958

Research into the life of the 5th century Roman-British Ursula surface historical variations that all point to the effort to preserve the memory of her noble and heroic life. Whether captured in exalted legendary tales or notations left on the stone work of a basilica bearing her name in Cologne, Germany the details emerge of a highly cultured and virtuous young woman of aristocratic background who was promised in marriage. Upon the terms of the nuptial agreement, she was to travel to Rome on pilgrimage accompanied by an entourage of similar maidens. From oral accounts, the finely vested young ladies enthralled all those whom they encountered with their stunning beauty; similarly, all were left enchanted by their talent for music, song, poetry, and wisdom. To those who gazed upon them, they felt that they were being blessed by a heavenly vision.

When confronted by a nomadic tribe of invading Huns from central Asia, the brutish vandals demanded that the women concede to being enslaved as concubines. St. Ursula preached Christian truths to the pagan occupiers and they were enraged by her unshakable faith. St. Ursula's boldness strengthened and inspired her companions by readying them for a nuptial ceremony that would have them enter into paradise. The obstinate Huns refusing to recognize the supremacy of God, gave orders that the valiant women be massacred.

Their valour lived on as a model for young women to imitate. The 12th century native German, St. Hildegard of Bingen, composed several poems and hymns in honour of St. Ursula's memory. The 16th century Italian saint, St. Angela Merici was so inspired by the example of St. Ursula, that she started the first religious teaching order of nuns (the Ursulines) dedicated to the education of young disadvantaged women to divert them from falling into the trap of human trafficking. A group of Ursuline nuns, led by St. Marie de l'Incarnation, founded a convent and boarding school that provided education for young girls in the settling days of Quebec; St. Marguerite d'Youville was given three years of formidable and definitive education by this same group of Ursulines. And so, as study and reflection continues to sift between myth and fact, the enduring and cherished influence of a resoundingly noble and heroic woman, like St. Ursula and those who imitated her, continues to captivate eager imaginations looking for examples to help inspire.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Trials can make us weary. The constant grind to cope with problems wears us down. This weekend Moses and Joshua are engaged in battle against Amalek, a physical battle that goes back and forth. It represents the struggles we face, whether emotional, mental or social.



How do we cope? Psalm 121 tells us "to lift our eyes to the mountains, that our help will come from Mount Zion and the Temple—the dwelling of the Lord who made heaven and earth." Moses by his action advises us to lift up our hands in prayer. The gospel suggests that we storm heaven, crying out "night and day" to the Lord.

It all comes down to one thing. Stay close to the Lord, never giving up hope. Keep your eyes firmly fixed on the Lord. He will vindicate you in all your struggles. Like the Israelites and the widow in today's Gospel, we face opposition and injustice—at times from godless and pitiless adversaries. We, too, must lift our eyes to the mountains—to Calvary and the God who will guard us from all evil.

Paul exhorts in today's Epistle, we need to remain faithful, to turn to the inspired Scriptures—given by God to train us in righteousness. So don't give up when trials come. Turn to God in faith.
