Nicholas Gomez Ďavila (1913-1994)

Colombian political and cultural commentator

Though his name and work remain relatively obscure, there is something very likable and engaging about this 20th century writer. Born in Bogota, Nicholas was from an affluent family who valued the worth of a classic education. He was sent to Paris for studies; being of poor health, he was unable to attend public lectures. Instead, he was tutored privately and developed a voracious appetite for reading. He never ended up attending any university and opted rather to be mentored by the literary masters of Western civilization. Upon his return to his native country, he compiled the most extensive personal library the country had ever known. Consequently, he put into practice his vast study of great minds by writing in a style that was accessible to his fellow citizens who were never accorded the same exposure to great books as he had been blessed. The concise phrases, known as aphorisms, were loaded with witty and penetrating insight into all matters of politics, religion, and culture unfolding around him in the Colombia of his day. He identified himself as a "reactionary" to avoid the tribal trappings of "conservative" or "liberal" grouping. Nicholas very much saw the demise of his own native country, scarred by so much internal violence in the narcowar being waged, as symptomatic of the decline of Western confidence in its own Christian historical narrative. With plenty of well-targeted criticism towards heads of government, leading clerics in the Church, influential members of society, Nicholas drew from the wisdom of tradition to counter what he saw as rootless and reckless ill-fated pop-up trends being imposed on a people in the name of progress and modernism. It was only when his work was translated into German and Italian, late in his lifetime, was his contribution and relevancy to contemporary discourse appreciated.

Paul testifies in the Epistle that the prayer of the lowly pierces the clouds and gives thanks to God for giving him strength in his imprisonment.

We are confident as the psalmist says that the Lord redeems the lives of his humble servant. So pray often and pray well. He will hear us in our distress, protect us from evil and bring us safely to his heavenly kingdom.

The deadline to submit First Communion Registration forms will be Friday, October 28th, 2022. Forms must be submitted in person at the parish office during office hours.


#### PRAYER INTENTIONS
