"Where the Bible mentions [same-sex sexual] behavior at all, it clearly condemns it. I freely grant that. The issue is precisely whether the biblical judgment is correct.

If one is looking for a scary story to compliment the season, the cited quote, and its staggering implications, ought to cause sufficient fright and alarm. Fr. James Martin, a prominent Jesuit who enjoys open endorsement from Pope Francis, inclusion in the pontifical council of social communications, and a vaulted vantage point as chief editor of America magazine, is best known for his outreach to individuals identifying with same-sex attraction. What marks his pastoral position from the Churches' traditional care to those struggling in sin is the recognition of the immutable and unalterable orientation of such an attraction. Instead of offering understanding and all the available means of natural and supernatural help in the Churches' perennial call to chastity, Fr. James Martin echoes society's chorus of normalizing and celebrating that which has been regarded as activity that is intrinsically disordered. (see catechism, 2357). As the cited quote suggests, Fr. James Martin is willing to even question Scripture's claim of inerrancy – of whether the Bible is infallible in its teaching concerning all that which is necessary for our salvation.

At this particular time, Cardinal Hollerich of Luxembourg, who has been appointed to oversee the proceedings of the Synod on Synodality, has publicly expressed similar opinion believing that "that the sociological-scientific foundation of this teaching is no longer correct." There are several other high-ranking prelates sharing that opinion. For those familiar with the Marian phenomena of Akita, Japan (1973), Our Blessed Mother warned, as a result of not having heeded the Fatima messages, "The work of the devil will infiltrate even into the Church in such a way that one will see cardinals opposing cardinals and bishops against other bishops. ... The Church will be full of those who accept compromises, and the devil will press many priests and consecrated souls to leave the service of the Lord." We have experienced the recent trend that whenever a topic gets difficult, the tendency has pushed towards changing the very meaning of the term. For example, if it is no longer convenient to accept the traditional definitions of the words "marriage", "woman", "vaccines", "recession" then a quickly altered and socially-acceptable reformulation has suddenly entered into existence. Within the Catholic Church, there are those who seem to be trending in that same direction - that which was once defined as sin and taught as true is being quickly redefined: that shift makes for a scary Halloween for us all.
