"If sinners be damned, at least let them leap to Hell over our dead bodies. And if they perish, let them perish with our arms wrapped about their knees, imploring them to stay. If Hell must be filled, let it be filled in the teeth of our exertions, and let not one go unwarned and unprayed for." Rev. Charles Spurgeon (1834-1892), English Preacher

At the start of this month of November, we respond to the Churches' perennial focus on praying for the souls of the dead. Cemetery visits and the inscribing of lost loved ones in books of remembrance stir memories fond and painful. Imploring the mercy of God, especially in the atoning sacrifice of the mass, helps us cope with lingering sorrow or stinging regret.

The cited quote comes from a relatively unknown Englishman, though during his own day was quite the London sensation. A look into his biographical background speaks of varied denominational influences from Calvinist, Methodist, Anglican, Baptist, Non-Conformist – sifting through the nuances was even too much for Charles Spurgeon, who settled on identifying himself as a Christian. To crack the caricature of the hard-crusted Victorian age, Charles preached with intensity, humour, boldness, and theatrics. His debut happened when he was only 15 years of age. Coming from a devout family who sent him off for theological training, it was while ducking his way out of storm by stepping into a church that his youthful zeal was ignited. Apparently, the preacher that day, before a sparse gathering, focused his sermon on the pitiful looking young Charles. The adolescent was challenged to live out the conviction of his Christian faith. Consequently, Charles stepped into his local church, took to the pulpit, and unleashed a latent gift of great yield. From small local gatherings in the Cambridge area, he made his way to larger metropolitan congregations. With his share of glowing praises and sharp criticisms in the London Times, his appeal to the masses was based on his sincerity for the salvation of souls. The cited quote serves as an appropriate indication of what each of us as Christians are called to do when praying for others- to go to extreme lengths to communicate to others our desire that they posses the very greatest of goods, oneness with Jesus Christ. The willingness to stand in harm's way and impede the luring pull of seditious forces upon the naïve and innocent would be the fitting tribute to where our energies are expended.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Praying for the dead.

2 nd Maccabees 12.46 records that when soldiers were preparing the bodies of their slain comrades for burial they discovered they were wearing amulets taken from a pagan temple which violated the law of Deuteronomy. So they prayed that God would forgive the sin these men had committed. The New Testament also echoes this notion in the



second letter of Timothy when Paul prays for someone who died named Onesiphorus, saying: "May the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church also has something to say about prayers for the dead, stating: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven" (1030).

At the point of death Catholics have the wonderful tradition of gathering together with family and friends, sometimes at the point of death, around the bedside of the deceased. Prayers would often continue for a period of time up to the point of the funeral mass where prayers are offered for the dead and their family. I invite us during the month of November to continue this tradition. Let us acknowledge the loving connection we enjoy with the living and the dead, through the mercy of God and the power of the Holy Spirit.
