Death and nature will stand aghast, when the creature shall rise again, to answer before his Judge.

The written book shall be brought forth, containing all for which the world must be judged. When, therefore, the Judge shall be seated, whatsoever is hidden shall be brought to light, naught shall remain unpunished.

- Dies Irae, 13th century Gregorian Chant, formally used at Masses for the Dead The foreboding tone of the Scripture readings, as we draw near to the end of the liturgical year, offer us a pulling back of the veil to turbulent events to come; they are intended to have us vigilant to the final realities of death, judgment and eternal fate (classically understood as eschatology). Apparently, the pathway to heaven is inundated with calamity and persecution. As illustrated in the cited lyrics to the medieval classic hymn, Dies Irae, a strong part of our Catholic tradition was to invite the faithful to reflect regularly upon such somber mysteries. Rather than sag demoralizingly under the sense of urgent responsibility they pose, the Church has always been galvanized that regardless of how difficult and absurd the signs of the times may appear, Christ has conquered and he already reigns.

While proposing end time realities can seem to be neurotically anxiety triggering, a recent episode shared among many Catholic commentators provides some perspective. The magician illusionist, Penn Jillette, from the duo Penn and Teller, after a show in Las Vegas, was approached by a Christian evangelical. The zealous Christian, noting how impressed he was by Penn's craft and skill, invited the agnostic to confess faith in Jesus Christ as Lord. Despite best efforts, Penn declined. Later Penn commented on the incident. Rather than feel annoyed, he was impressed by the Christian's conviction – he clearly believed that he had something/someone good and essential to share. Penn noted that if one did believe that one possessed life-altering, eternal-destiny-shaping information, how much would one have to hate someone to not ever share such transformative news? And so, as awkward and ominous as calling consciences to eschatological mysteries may seem, seen in their ultimate light, alerting others of all that shall to come to pass is and salvific act of great charity.
