<u>Christmas Prayer</u>

Lord Jesus Christ, the angels proclaimed You as the Saviour born for us. In our own day, the battle against sin threatens so much of our societal stability. Darkness seems to eclipse the Light that you revealed to the world. Deliver us anew from all the danger and fear that enslayes us.

Lord Jesus Christ, by the mystery of your Incarnation your divinity was hidden in the humility of a new born baby. At a time when what it is to be human has been distorted by ambiguity and falsehood, help us to accept our own humanity. Heal us from all the lies that cause us to reject our bodies and open us to the wonder of your saving grace you are so willing to share.

Lord Jesus Christ, the manger scene illustrates the conditions of poverty and simplicity by which you entered the world. As we face a winter that warns of market instability, job losses, food shortages, fuel rationing, strengthen us with confidence to trust in Our Heavenly Father's care for us in the same manner as your parents, Joseph and Mary. Amen. There are only three types of people; those who have found God and serve him; those who have not found God and seek him, and those who live not seeking, or finding him. The first are rational and happy; the second unhappy and rational, and the third foolish and unhappy. Blaise Pascal (1623-1662),

French mathematician, philosopher and religious writer

The Nativity scene presents us again the angels' announcement of a Saviour born. The shepherds' response of running in haste is attributed to their lowly status and their desperate predicament for some confirming sign of pending deliverance. Neighbouring Jerusalem (less than 10 kms away) carries on oblivious to the otherwise hidden splendor. For so many of us, the same unfolding drama of assessing the impact of astounding news against a backdrop of apathy and indifference confronts our most intimate realities.

The Paris of Blaise Pascal's day was gripped by the those same tensions. For the majority of intellectuals, the rippling influence of the Enlightenment movement and Protestantism cast a dark shadow of cynicism and boredom ("ennui") on the claims of Christian revelation. Pascal's impressive contribution to public discourse was his keen intellect and proven ability as a rigorous thinker yet believing Christian. To rouse devotion and reverence for so many of his fellow citizens who had grown skeptical and uninterested, Pascal tried to pierce consciences by reminding them of the great temptations to misery and despair if one abandons the desire for salvation. While agitating others as a tactic caused to make him unwelcomed and shunned, owing to his undeniable intelligence it was impossible to dismiss him. Pascal warned people of being lost in distraction and vain pursuits without the search for God and tragedy of foregoing his grace.

Since the time of Pascal's writing, modern commentators have noted that for so much of Christianity's history, effort has focused on teaching and persuading people to move from the second category cited in the quote to the first. As for discerning our current cultural context, immense effort is needed to at least inch people from the third classification to the second.

As we gather with and encounter loved ones and acquaintances these Christmas days, blessings to all those trying their best to incite those who have perhaps ceased to seek towards a sparked wonder at the marvel of the Saviour born.
