+ new year 2023 * Vice is a monster of so frightful mien As to be hated needs but to be seen; Yet seen too oft, familiar with her face, We first endure, then pity, then embrace. Alexander Pope (1688-1744), English poet

In the aftermath of the English Reformation, the ensuing penal laws severely restricted social upward mobility for all non-Protestants. Born into a Catholic family, Alexander was raised outside of London. His father, having died when Alexander was two, left the family with sufficient means from his successful dealings as a linen merchant. Consequently, Alexander, of short stature and suffering from a curvature of the spine, benefited from a sound education through private tutors. By 12 years of age, he was proficient in the classical languages of Greek and Latin. Seeing as how his opportunities were limited on account of his Catholic background and fragile health, he concentrated his talents of intelligence and wit. "To err is human, to forgive, divine," "fools rush in where angels fear to tread," "a little learning is a dangerous thing" are but a few of some of his notable and often repeated contributions to literature and conversation.

Alexander Pope's love for writing had him produce many works of satire and social commentary. The cited section is taken from his, Essay of Man. In the first line, the word, "mien" is no longer in popular usage. It derives from the word – demeanor: appearance bearing an expression, attitude, personality. The brief stanza speaks to how easily we can become habituated and seduced by the distortions and adulterations of that which we know to be good. With the Feast of the Holy Family being transferred to Friday, December 30, this year, Alexander Pope's warning on society's facile accommodation and acceptance to counterfeits provides insight into conscience. Ongoing exposure to an evil that initially repulsed us eventually weakens our resistance. The free, total, faithful, and fruitful holy love that marked the lives of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph provides the model for our own families. So many of us are painfully aware of how we have allowed aberrations and deviations to infiltrate and compromise the love that is meant to be shared between spouses, children and parents. May our ongoing efforts and prayers to aspire and live out a genuine love for our families be blessed by the heart-warming glow of the Nativity scene's tenderness and intimacy. CC Ponder
