I now say to all who were entrusted to my service in the Church: Stand firm in the faith! Do not be confused! ... For 60 years now, I have accompanied the path of theology, especially biblical studies, and have seen seemingly unshakeable theses collapse with the changing generations, which turned out to be mere hypotheses: the liberal generation (Harnack, Jülicher, etc.), the existentialist generation (Bultmann, etc.), the Marxist generation. I have seen, and see, how, out of the tangle of hypotheses, the reasonableness of faith has emerged and is emerging anew. Jesus Christ is truly the Way, the Truth, and the Life - and the Church, in all her shortcomings, is truly His Body.

- Pope Benedict XVI, (1927-2022), Final Spiritual Testament As the significance of Pope Benedict's long-expected death is being assessed, the cited words serve as a balancing and focal point against all other commentaries. As is tradition to all those called to take up the role as Successor to St Peter, a testimony is documented at the time of election. Pope Benedict XVI was drawing from his time-tested experience as a theologian and head of the Congregation of the Doctrine of Faith. He had seen critiques and attacks against the Christian faith throughout his life span. From his perspective, the eclipsing of God from public life leads to humanity losing its bearings with increasing and inevitable destructive effects. The path forward for the Church is to either build upon the teaching tradition of the Church or risk further deterioration into an irrelevant entity. Pope Benedict XVI's encouragement is that all those who stand in opposition to Christ and His Church will be dispatched in due time and those faithful to Christ will be vindicated in their fidelity.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Jesus speaks through the prophet Isaiah in today's First Reading. He tells us of the mission given to Him by the Father from the womb: "You are My / servant,' He said to Me."



Servant and Son, our Lord was sent to lead a new ex-

odus-to raise up the exiled tribes of Israel, to gather and restore them to God. More than that, He was to be a light to the nations, that God's salvation may reach to the ends of the earth

In the new exodus, Jesus is the "Lamb of God," as John beholds Him in the Gospel today. Our Lord sings of this in today's Psalm. He has come, He says, to offer His body to do the will of God The sacrifices, oblations, holocausts, and sin-offerings given after the first exodus had no power to take away sins (see Hebrews 10:4). They were meant not to save but to teach (see Galatians 3:24). In offering these sacrifices, the people were to learn self-sacrifice-that they were made for worship, to offer themselves freely to God and to delight in His will.

Only Jesus could make that perfect offering of Himself. And through His sacrifice, He has given us ears open to obedience and made it possible for us to hear the Father's call to holiness, as Paul says in today's Epistle.
