Men wanted for hazardous journey. Low wages, bitter cold, long hours of complete darkness. Safe return doubtful. Honour and recognition in event of success.

- Ernest Shackleton, (1874-1922), Anglo-Irish Antarctic explorer Quoted many times over as a motivational prompt, the legendary advertisement was to have appeared in the London times prior to expedition. The grim rallying cry for recruiting is hailed as a resounding success as far as a promotional pitch. Men in the thousands were to have been attracted to the prospect as potential sailors despite the less than promising burden to benefit ratio yield. From all accounts of Shackleton's diary, he and his crew of 27 barely survived their grueling and harrowing mission. Their boat became locked in ice and split apart from glacier pressure. As they wintered on an ice barge, they drifted further from land which made rowing back on their life boats all the more difficult in the tempestuous arctic ocean. The rest of their death-defying adventure reads like a major motion picture.

As we begin the season of Lent, an appeal to that same bravery for every Christian man, woman and child is appropriate. The Shackelton crew all miraculously survived 20 months of the bleakest of conditions; they struggled to find the will to live and the audacity to hope when all seemed lost. The heroic stories that each of them were left to tell would last them a lifetime. The 40 days that lay before us summon us to confront the ugly reality of sin within us and in our world. With Christ leading this noble venture, what comparable conquests will we have to tell in staring down our bitter nemesis?


CONFIRMATION SPONSOR WEEKEND
