Let us give thanks to God for living in times like these for now it is permitted for no one to be mediocre.

Pope Pius XI (1857-1939)

As a young student, Achille Ratti, born into a working class family in the region of Lombardy, displayed at an early age two impressive talents: an all absorbing, expansive mind for studies and a fierce determination for mountain climbing. With an education system that fed his astute memory for philosophy, languages, and history and the Alps in the backdrop, he scaled to impressive peeks in each of the respective terrains. Ordained as priest, he was assigned to be the head of the Libraries of St. Ambrose in Milan and of the Vatican where he further refined his knowledge of geopolitics. Subsequently, he was assigned as nuncio to Warsaw to help guide the Polish people during the rise of atheism being forced upon them from the Bolshevik revolution. Archbishop Ratti became adept at discerning the stream of lies, falsehoods and double-speak from the propaganda campaigns pitched to make faithful Catholics look like enemies of the State. Elected as Pope in 1922, he saw the ominous darkening clouds of atheistic totalitarianism expand across Europe in the build up towards WWII. He strove urgently to sound the alarm bells within the Church for the faithful to not be seduced by the pernicious influence of the world; he sensed too many from within the structure of the Church all too eager to win the world's esteem in the building of a false utopia.

May this Lenten time provide us with a vantage point for helping us discern and detect who and where are the sources propagating revolt against revealed truth. While it is painful to look within as to where we may have compromised and capitulated to distortions of faith, this penitential time is one for renouncing evil and strengthening resolve to keep vigil with Our Lord as he renews his agony through the suffering members of His Church. Indeed, each and every Christian is to cast off mediocrity and indifference and enter into the spiritual conflict of our day.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Jesus is thirsty, in today's Gospel. He thirsts for souls. He longs to give the Samaritan woman the living waters that well up to eternal life.

These waters couldn't be drawn from the well of Jacob, father of the Israelites and the Samaritans. But Jesus was something greater than Jacob.



The Samaritans were Israelites who escaped exile when Assyria conquered the Northern Kingdom eight centuries before Christ. They were despised for intermarrying with non-Israelites and worshipping at Mount Gerazim, not Jerusalem.

But Jesus tells the woman that the "hour" of true worship is coming, when all will worship God in Spirit and truth.

Jesus' "hour" is the "appointed time" that Paul speaks of in today's Epistle. It is the hour when the Rock of our salvation was struck on the Cross. Struck by the soldier's lance, living waters flowed out from our Rock. These waters are the Holy Spirit, the gift of God.

By the living waters the ancient enmities of Samaritans and Jews have been washed away, the dividing wall between Israel and the nations is broken down. Since His hour, all may drink of the Spirit in Baptism. In the Eucharist, the Lord now is in our midst—as He was at the Rock of Horeb and at the well of Jacob.

In the "today" of our Liturgy, He calls us to believe: "I am He," come to pour out the love of God into our hearts through the Holy Spirit. How can we continue to worship as if we don't understand? How can our hearts remain hardened?


