Hosting their daily podcast from their “Virgin Most Powerful Radio” platform, these two laymen present their credentials as “two Catholics with Phds in common sense.” For anyone who has ever noticed the Lighthouse Catholic Media stand with the cds from well-known speakers, that is the work of Terry Barber. The now 60+ year old Californian was at one time in formation for priesthood. Noting the breakdown in orthodoxy during his studies, he discerned a call to marriage. While Terry Barber struggles with a mild reading dyslexia, his laser-like focus on presenting the fullness of Catholic teachings is a refreshing and welcomed blessing for those who are weary of the timid “accompaniment” style of most clergy. In fact, Terry Barber had to start his own radio station because he dared address controversial topics that got him censored and reprimanded on other Catholic media sites.

Riding along Terry Barber is his long-time friend and former Los Angeles police sheriff, Jesse Romero. A former boxer and weight-lifter, Jesse’s deeper conversion to Jesus Christ was, as self-described, a result of his attempts to make sense out of the insanity he saw in his law enforcement duty. Jesse understood and has seen first hand the effects of the spiritual battle spilling over into the chaos of a society in decay. He complemented his police training with extensive studies at the renowned Franciscan University of Stubenville, OH. He appeals to those looking for training in “full contact Catholicism.” On Good Shepherd Sunday, these two valiant men are doing their part in voicing what needs to be said and keeping those in positions of hierarchy accountable towards their responsibilities.

Of the many taglines echoed on their show, they note that they are “blessed by the best, too anointed to be disappointed and if hope was money, we would be billionaires.” On their social analysis of living in America, they conclude each podcast asserting that “the best state to be living in...not California, not Texas, not Florida, but...a State of Grace.”

FROM THE PASTOR’S DESK



As we hear in today’s Gospel, Jesus is that Good Shepherd, sent to a people who were like sheep without a shepherd . He calls not only to the children of Israel but to all those far off from Him—to whomever the Lord wishes to hear His voice.

The call of the Good Shepherd leads to the restful waters of Baptism, to the anointing oil of Confirmation, and to the table and overflowing cup of the Eucharist, as we sing in today’s Psalm.

Again on this Sunday in Easter, we hear His voice calling us His own. He should awaken in us the response of those who heard Peter’s preaching. “What are we to do?” they cried.

We have been baptized. But each of us goes astray like sheep, as we hear in today’s Epistle. We still need daily to repent, to seek forgiveness of our sins, to separate ourselves further from this corrupt generation.

We are called to follow in the footsteps of the Shepherd of our souls. By His suffering He bore our sins in His body to free us from sin. But His suffering is also an example for us. From Him we should learn patience in our afflictions, to hand ourselves over to the will of God.

Jesus has gone ahead, has driven us through the dark valley of evil and death. His Cross has become the narrow gate through which we must pass to reach His empty tomb—the verdant pastures of life abundant.
