As her community of the Poor Clare's of Perpetual Adoration honours the marking of the centenary date of her birth, the lasting influence of this American nun from Canton, Ohio lives on in the impressive mission she initiated. Born into a broken marriage, the young Rita Rizzo knew all the difficulties of abandonment, childhood illness, struggles in education, poverty, and continual upheaval. Her extraordinary and providential steps from starting off with nothing to building a media empire broadcast into the homes of 150 million Americans and countless others worldwide is worth studying. Her EWTN webpage chronicles all the stumbling blocks and milestones that create a script almost too improbable for even the wildest of fiction narratives.

The legacy of Mother Angelica is of a faithful and resilient consecrated woman who sought to respond to the inspired promptings her Lord was placing upon her heart. She remains an intriguing mystery of blending the best of progressive methods of advancing the proclamation of the gospel while seeking to defend and explain the greatness of Churches' ancient traditions. She is most noted for upsetting countless Bishops and politicians along the way using her honed in skills of savvy street talk style of "telling it like it is". A no nonsense style that still was infused with reverence and deep piety.

On this Fifth Sunday of Easter, with Jesus' impassioned assurance that He alone is, "The Way, The Truth, and the Life," the cited quote typifies Mother Angelica's unyielding and uncompromising commitment to defending and announcing to the world the saving truth found in Him.

His Word continues its work in the world through the Church. We see its beginnings today in Jerusalem. It is destined to spread with influence and power and to become the imperishable seed by which every heart is born anew.
