

He is hidden in the brightness of the radiance which issues from the everlasting throne. He is in the very abyss of peace, where there is no voice of tumult or distress, but a deep stillness--stillness, that greatest and most awful of all goods which we can fancy; that most perfect of joys, the utter profound, ineffable tranquility of the Divine Essence. He has entered into His rest. That is our home; here we are on a pilgrimage, and Christ calls us to His many mansions which He has prepared.

- St. John Henry Cardinal Newman (1801-1890), a sermon on the Ascension

While perhaps not familiar to most Catholics, this recently 2019 canonized Englishman made an immense contribution to the life of the Church in the 19th century and whose impact is still being felt. John Henry Newman grew up in the best of what the Church of England had to offer – erudite education, disciplined formation, liturgies of great choral music, and polished preaching. And yet, the higher and deeper he pursued his Anglican faith, the more in touch he became with his foundational cracks. As a prominent member of the renowned Oxford University, his scholarship led him to the sound conclusion that the more one engages with problems of doctrine and morality, the more one needs to return back to the sources of history, the early Church Fathers and Scripture. In his prolific collection of essays, sermons and books, his conversion to Catholicism was the fruitful result of his sincere research. Notably, John Henry's entrance into the Catholic Church was through a Passionist priest stationed who heard Newman's confession well into the night - they had to pause and continue the next day! Forsaking the prestige of his post and upsetting many Anglican clergymen who opposed the Holy See, Newman sought off for Rome and entered into formation as a Roman Catholic priest in the Oratorian order of St. Philip Neri. His subsequent pastoral work had him return back to England, where he used his formidable intellectual gifts to preach and teach. Because of his familiarity with higher education, his appeal to those like-minded truth seekers at Oxford and Cambridge also led to an invitation to found a Catholic university in Dublin. The demands on his time and strength were excessive in trying to appeal to both the Irish and English. He consumed himself in trying to establish the ideal of quality education and campus life. Moreover, on account of his influence, his sphere of significant contribution extended to politics and broader Church matters as the First Vatican Council defined the doctrine of Papal Infallibility. His was a balanced, adept, strong, orthodox voice capable of articulating Church teaching. For all his heroic efforts, he was elevated to the College of Cardinals by Pope Leo XIII, in May of 1879.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In today's First Reading from the Acts of the Apos-

tles, St. Luke gives the surprising news that there is From the more of the story to be told. The story did not end Pastor's desk with the empty tomb, or with Jesus' appearances to the Apostles over the course of forty days. Jesus' saving work will have a liturgical consummation. He is the great high priest, and He has still to ascend to the heavenly Jerusalem, there to celebrate the feast in the true Holy of Holies. Indeed, His intercession will lead to the Holy Spirit's descent in fire upon the Church. Luke spells out that promise in the First Reading for the feast of the Ascension: "in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit" (Acts 1:5). The Ascension is the preliminary feast that directs the Church's attention forward to Pentecost. On that day, salvation will be complete; for salvation is not simply expiation for sins (that would be wonder enough), but it is something even greater than that. Expiation is itself a necessary precondition of our adoption as God's children. To live that divine life we must receive the Holy Spirit. To receive the Holy Spirit we must be purified through Baptism.

Happy feast of the Ascension. Where Jesus has gone may we too follow.
