Three names are thus to be seen in the fire, each has its own authority, each exists individually, each acts by itself and appears distinct: Individual qualities which are coming led together—fire wondrously, light gloriously and heat distinctly, each dwelling in harmony with the others. How much more, then, is it right that we should accept in simplicity those Three Persons, receiving them with love, and not with questions. Their nature should not have to chase after us and become like unto us—for they are like only themselves in all respects. Created beings are distinct and unlike one another, so how much more is that Being, Great beyond all, distinct from everything else.

- St Ephrem, (+373) Doctor of the Church, from his, Hymn on the Trinity

With his feast day being celebrated this week on June 9, this influential yet lesser known theologian originally hails from the remote, inconspicuous town of Nusaybin, located on the Turkey/Syrian border. The veins of history have seen shifts in occupations from Assyrian, Roman, Byzantine, Persian, Arab, Mongol Ottoman. Today, the region is valiantly trying to recover from the calamitous and horrifying February earthquakes.

The young Ephrem was known as a devout monk who served as a deacon. His theological works not only helped accurately explain the faith to the nascent Christian community but on account of his expansive artistic ability, he helped explain the mysteries of our faith by composing his writings using poetry and lyrical chant. St. Ephrem was masterful at crafting the "earworm" – melodic tunes loaded with dogmatic depth, tending to all the integral components of rhyme, meter, diction...of the Syrian language. The Church attributes to him the title, "The Harp of the Holy Spirit."

In the cited work, Ephrem compares the mystery of the Holy Trinity to the sun – the fire to the Father, the light to the Son, and the heat to the Holy Spirit. His lyrics inspire a sense of wonder and reverence that was capable of being embraced and enjoyed by the people of his day. For ourselves, each of us has our favourite artists and musicians- how great is their contribution when their artistic creativity helps draw us into a more profound understanding and appreciation of heavenly realities! And so, offer a special prayer for all such gifted composers this June 9.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We often begin Mass with the prayer from today's Epistle: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." We praise the God who



has revealed Himself as a Trinity, a communion of persons.Communion with the Trinity is the goal of our worship and the purpose of the salvation history that begins in the Bible and continues in the Eucharist and sacraments of the Church.

In commanding Abraham in the first reading to offer his only beloved son God was preparing us for the fullest possible revelation of His love for the world.

As Abraham was willing to offer Isaac, God did not spare His own Son but handed Him over for us all.

In this, He revealed what was only disclosed partially to Moses—that His kindness continues for a thousand generations, that He forgives our sin and takes us back as His very own people.

Jesus humbled Himself to die in obedience to God's will. And for this, the Spirit of God raised Him from the dead, and gave Him a name above every name

This is the name we glorify in today's Responsorial: the name of our Lord, the God who is Love (see 1 John 4)
