By the Blessed Virgin Mary, I ask that you make peace with your father. See, the soldiers are burning houses, destroying crops and breaking everything in pieces. Not with weapons, my son, we cannot fix the problem with weapons, but rather with dialogue, continuing negotiations to fix these conflicts. I will make the troops of the king go away and that the demands of the son be attended to but please remember, that you have a most serious duty to your father as his son and as a subject to his king.

- St. Elizabeth of Portugal (1271-1336), Feast Day, July 4

Perhaps the most compelling feature of this otherwise obscure saint is the fact that despite or because of her stellar family background and upbringing, her own adult life was plunged into a series of domestic crises. Elizabeth's noble and royal pedigree included being the niece of the revered St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Her childhood was steeped in prayer, self-control and the practice of every virtue. Promised into marriage at the age of 12 to the Portuguese King, a monarch who was over 10 years her senior. By the age of 17, she was the mother of two sons, Alphonso and Constance. She sought to transform the excesses of the royal court and its entourage into a task force committed to the poor and implement a convent-like discipline to effectively carry out the responsibility of good governance. Her husband, while accommodating her piety, was not ready to match her in devotion and zeal. He fathered numerous other children outside of their marriage. She continued to treat him with kindness and encouragement to total conversion.

As her eldest son matured, he saw the illegitimate sons of his father being treated with favour and a threat to his pending reign. Alphonso declared war on his father. As the cited quote suggests, she pleaded with her son to acknowledge the great devastation that he was unleashing on so many other innocent souls. She fasted and did penance for them both and knelt before them on the battlefield to negotiate not only a truce but repentance on both their part. Her husband died shortly thereafter having received the sacraments.

Subsequently, in her early 50's, after a pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela, she renounced her crown. St. Elizabeth withdrew to life in a convent of Poor Clares in Coimbra where she sought to dedicate her efforts full time to prayer and charity. Nonetheless, she was once again pressed into action to avert carnage. Her son sought vengeance upon the ill treatment of his daughter who was given away in an arranged marriage to strengthen royal family alliances. The family in dispute was one of the former King's illegitimate children. Consequently, a weakened yet determined Elizabeth found a way to reconcile son and son-in-law; clearly, her own family was the cause of much concern and anguish. And so, as much as St. Elizabeth desired and lived a life of modesty, harmony and calm, she was not spared family problems that spilled over into public dramas. Accordingly, there is a great consolation for all those who find themselves praying and interceding for family members, locked in impossible dramas. Instead of being void of conflict and confrontation, her cultivated skill at peace-making ended up being her greatest attribute.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Liturgy this week continues to instruct us in the elements of discipleship. We're told that even the most humble among us have a share in the mission Christ gives to His Church.

We're not all called to the ministry of the Apostles, or to be prophets like Elisha in today's First Reading.

But each of us is called to a holy life. At Baptism our lives were joined forever to the cross of Christ, as Paul tells us in today's Epistle. Baptized into His death, we're to renounce sin and live for God in Christ Jesus.

We are to follow Him, each of us taking up our personal cross, as Jesus says in today's Gospel. That doesn't mean we will all be asked to suffer a martyr's death. But each of us is called to self-denial, to the offering of our lives in service of God's plan.

We do this by opening our hearts and homes to the service of the Lord, following the Shunnamite woman's example in today's First Reading. As Jesus tells us, we're to receive others—not only prophets but also little children, the poor, and the imprisoned—as we receive Christ Himself. As we sing in today's Psalm, we are to testify to His favors and kindness in our lives.

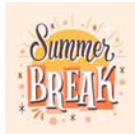
We're to hold fast to the promise—that if we have died with Christ, we shall also live, that if we lose our lives for His sake, we shall find our reward and walk forever in His countenance.

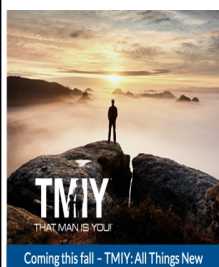
WHAT FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION PARTICIPANTS

FIRST FRIDAY - HOLY HOUR

Please join us in this holy hour of prayers during the Eucharistic adoration on First Fridays of every month. We start with the 3 O'clock Prayer and the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00pm. Then, we continue with Prayers of Adoration, Thanksgiving, Reparation, and Intercession. We also pray the Eucharistic Rosary and the Litany of the Blessed Sacrament. We end the hour with a hymn of praise and adoration at 4:00pm. All are welcome.
