I sit with Shakespeare, and he winces not. Across the color line I move arm and arm with Balzac and Dumas, where smiling men and welcoming women glide in gilded halls. From out of the caves of evening that swing between the strong-limbed Earth and the tracery of stars, I summon Aristotle and Aurelius and what soul I will, and they come all graciously with no scorn nor condescension. So, wed with Truth, I dwell above the veil. - William Edward Burghardt Du Bois, scholar (1868-1963)

As we prepare students to return back to their studies, the cited quote exhibits an admirable ease and expertise with the world of classic literature. While we may be long out of touch with the masters of English, French, Greek, and Latin composition, a curiosity and respect for the sublime thinking of the great minds that have laid a foundation for the civilized and scientific world never ought to escape us – regardless of how many years it has been since we have set foot in a classroom. Ideally, we all ought to foster a love for great books. The focus and concentration required for reading is a perfect antidote to the typical mindless screen-scrolling that all-too-often whittles away our free time.

What is even more impressive about the quote is that its writer was African American and studied at a time when there were obvious social/racial impediments to higher education. Born in Massachusetts to free parents, W.E.B. Du Bois shattered the thresholds of expectations as he excelled in his studies, being the first African American to achieve a doctoral degree at Harvard.

Throughout his writing and teaching career, Du Bois argued that while apprenticeship training offered its benefits in helping young people establish themselves in some employable and wage-earning skill, the pursuit of a classic education upon which Western civilization was founded ought to never drop from the curriculum. For those so inclined, they ought to be encouraged. He remained forever grateful for the opportunity granted to him and was rightly proud of the discipline and character that was fostered in him by the demanding pursuit of advanced learning. For concerned parents and students who are following current trends of academic content, Du Bois' insights and voice ought to be echoed and amplified.

William Edward Burghardt Du Bois, died on this day, August 27, 1963.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Jesus, the root and offspring of David, alone holds the kingdom's keys. In giving those keys to Peter, Jesus fulfills that prophecy, establishing Peter—and all who succeed him—as holy father of His Church.



His Church, too, is the new house of God, the kind spiritual temple founded on the "rock" of Peter

and built up out of the living stones of individual believers. Abraham was called "the rock" from which the children of Israel were hewn . And Peter becomes the rock from which God raises up new children of God.

The word Jesus uses—"church" (*ekklesia* in Greek)—was used in the Greek translation of the Old Testament for the "assembly" of God's children after the Exodus.

His Church is the "assembly of the firstborn", established by Jesus' exodus. Like the Israelites, we are baptized in water, led by the Rock, and fed with spiritual food.

Gathered at His altar, in the presence of angels, we sing His praise and give thanks to His holy name.

FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION

First Friday Adoration, is a Eucharistic adoration held the first Friday of every month in the church. It begins with 9:15 AM Mass and is followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for the remainder of the day. Adoration concludes at 7:00pm followed by Mass.



WHAT FIRST FRIDAY ADORATION PARTICIPANTS DO: Come any time during the adoration hours (approximately 10:00 AM to

6:30 PM) to spend some quiet, prayerful time with Jesus. Adoration participants commit to specific time (There will be sign-up sheets in the Narthex). These "Guardians of the Eucharist" ensure that the Blessed Sacrament is never left alone.

FIRST FRIDAY - HOLY HOUR

Please join us in this holy hour of prayers during the Eucharistic adoration on First Fridays of every month. We start with the 3 O'clock Prayer and the Divine Mercy Chaplet at 3:00pm. Then, we continue with Prayers of Adoration, Thanksgiving, Reparation, and Intercession. We also pray the Eucharistic Rosary and the Litany of the Blessed Sacrament. We end the hour with a hymn of praise and adoration at 4:00pm. All are welcome.

<u>THAT MAN IS YOU</u>

Starting Saturday, September 9th at 7:15 a.m. St. Marguerite D'Youville Parish will commence **"That Man is You"** ministry with the theme "<u>All Things New"</u>. It will be conducted over a 26-week period. MARRIAGE PREP COURSE


