O God, we beseech You to grant us through the merits and intercession of St. Aegidius to flee from the vanity and praise of this world, to carefully avoid all occasions of sin, to cleanse our hearts from all wickedness by a sincere confession, to leave this world in Your love and rich in good works, and to find You gracious on the day of judgment. Through Christ our Lord. Prayer in honour of St. Aegidius, Abbot (640-720), Feast Day, Sept 1 Born in Athens to noble parents, upon their death when he was 24 years of age, he mourned not only their loss but also his aimless life of vain pursuits. To grieve their death and pledge himself to a life of prayer and penance, he took voyage across the Aegean and Mediterranean seas to arrive in southern France. Finding a remote cave along the Rhone valley, outside the city of

France. Finding a remote cave along the Rhone valley, outside the city of Nimes, he surrendered himself to a life concealed. St. Aegidius is known by his French and popular English name, St. Giles. As tradition holds, he sustained himself on a diet of roots, herbs, berries and the milk of a doe. St. Giles' solitude was interrupted when the local Frankish king accidentally struck him with an arrow while on a hunting expedition. The hunters were so impressed that St. Giles wished no compensation for the errant shot that they sent him other aspiring men so as to be mentored by his devout life. Tradition holds that in the build up to the Battle of Tours (732), where Charles Martel eventually routed the Muslim advance into France, St. Giles' influence upon the formation and training of soldiers provided sound credibility for the defense of Christian citizens and territorial rights.

Given the current simmering tensions in France over whatever if left of French Catholicism, dominant secularism, and large segments of Islamic populations within the country, the intercession of this pious hermit/monk is needed to help sort out the entangled complexities of seemingly irresolvable age-old conflicts. In seeking to carve a pathway forward, how wise it would be to be attentive to the rich history that the country and culture have to offer.
