The Sino-Vatican Agreement, instead of leading to a new birth of religious freedom for Catholics in China, is instead being used by the CCP for its own purposes. And these are, it is now clear, to decapitate the Church hierarchy by slow-rolling the appointment of bishops while at the same time slowly strangling Catholicism itself out of existence.

Born in 1948, this Californian enrolled in the US Navy as a young man where he did field work as an officer in Japan and Hong Kong. Having acquired fluency in Mandarin and Cantonese, he applied to Stanford to further his interests in Asian studies. As a 30 year old graduate student, he was granted rare permission to complete sociological research in Taiwan and mainland China. Over the period of 20 months in 1979, he was exposed to the regime's brutal one child policy for population control and the forced abortions of peasant women. He wrote extensively about the topic and was subsequently expelled both from the country and from his position with Stanford university. In trying to cope with the horrors that he witnessed, he converted from his atheist, pro-choice position and entered into an RCIA program under the spiritual direction of a devout Benedictine monk. He and his wife went on to have 9 children.

Steven Mosher continues to this day to write about global population control efforts and policy in China; Steven is recognized as a leading world authority. In the cited quote, he comments on the disastrous 2018 unpublished Vatican-Sino accord. Despite the warnings of prominent clergy from the underground persecuted Catholic Church in China, the treaty has resulted in the Chinese Communist Party complete oversight of the selection of bishops who prioritize loyalty to the government over faithfulness to traditional teachings of the Church – the recent appointment of a compromised candidate to the diocese of Shanghai is evidence of the Pope Francis' diplomatic effort having gone awry. The suffering and canceled Chinese Catholics very much deserve our solidarity and prayer.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Our readings this weekend are more than a lesson in Church order. They also suggest how we're to deal with those who trespass against us, a theme that we'll hear in next week's readings as well. Notice that both the Gospel and the First Reading presume that believers have a duty



to correct sinners in our midst. Ezekiel is even told that he will be held accountable for their souls if he fails to speak out and try to correct them.

This is the love that Paul in today's Epistle says we owe to our neighbors. To love our neighbors as ourselves is to be vitally concerned for their salvation. We must make every effort, as Jesus says, to win our brothers and sisters back, to turn them from the false paths.

We should never correct out of anger or a desire to punish. Instead, our message must be that of today's Psalm—urging the sinner to hear God's voice, not to harden their hearts, and to remember that He is the one who made us, and the rock of our salvation. **f.s. Roger**
