Clearly, what God wants, above all, is our will, which we received as a free gift from God in creation and possess as though our own. When a man trains himself to acts of virtue, it is with the help of grace from God, from whom all good things come ... The will is what man has, as his unique possession.

St Joseph of Cupertino (1603-1663), Feast Day, September 18

Born into poverty and obscurity, this Franciscan Friar will be ever connected not only to the town of which his name is synonymous, but also the extraordinary manifestations of which became commonplace. Because of the meager means of his upbringing, the young Joseph was not only deprived of opportunity at formal education and apprenticeships but was known to be developmentally delayed in regards to his intelligence. He was often found "slack-jawed" – with a stupefied gaze, mouth drawn open, that made him look easily distracted. He endured severe ridicule and rejection from all and the effort to overcome his temper was where his character was forged. As a young man, he was admitted, on account of pity, to the Franciscan Order for the lowly task of stable keeper. The barnyard animals, while cleaning their stalls and providing them hay, became his friends. Eventually, the cause of his apparent mental deficiency and constant lack of concentration came into sharper focus. Joseph was being drawn into spiritual ecstasies; the slightest contact with a sacred image or conversation would lead him into a mystical rapture. St. Joseph of Cupertino, as most of his artistic renditions illustrate, was graced/burdened with the phenomena of levitation. What he lacked in literacy and academic study, he was granted with infused knowledge of profound mysteries – so much so, that he was ordained to the priesthood despite barely knowing how to read and write. He became a source of fascination for many; he also drew the jealousy of other clergy and was forced into seclusion, for a period of 35 years. He bore all with obedience and humility and understood that the previous humiliations of his childhood were all a preparation for the needed witness of God's power that he was meant to manifest. Eventually, he was compelled to leave the town of Cupertino (located in the southern city of Brindisi, in the "heel" of Italy) and died in the small town of Osimo, just outside of the Adriatic coastal city of Ancona.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Mercy and forgiveness should be at the heart of the Christian life.

Yet, as today's First Reading wisely reminds us, often we cherish our wrath, nourish our anger, and refuse mercy to those who have done us wrong. Jesus, too, strikes close to home in today's Gospel with His realistic portrayal of the wicked servant who won't forgive a fellow servant's debt, even though his own slate has just been wiped clean by their master.

It can't be this way in the kingdom, the Church. In the Old Testament, seven is frequently a number associated with mercy and the forgiveness of sins. The just man sins seven times daily; there is a sevenfold sprinkling of blood for atonement of sins. But Jesus tells Peter today that we must forgive not seven times, but seventy times seven times. That means: every time.

We are to be merciful as our Father in heaven is merciful (see [Luke 6:36](#); [Matthew 5:48](#)). But why? Why does Jesus repeatedly warn that we can't expect forgiveness for our trespasses unless we're willing to forgive others their trespasses against us?

Because, as Paul reminds us in today's Epistle, we are the Lord's. Each of us has been purchased by the blood of Christ shed for us on the Cross. As we sing in today's Psalm, though we deserved to die for our sins, He doesn't deal with us according to our crimes. The mercy and forgiveness we show to others should be the heartfelt expression of our gratitude for the mercy and forgiveness shown to us.

This is why we should remember our last days, set our enmities aside, and stop judging others. We know that one day we will stand before the judgment seat and give account for what we've done with the new life given to us by Christ.

So we forgive each other from the heart, overlook each other's faults, and await the crown of His kindness and compassion.

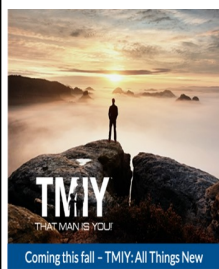
