If it is necessary to give one's life to be identified with Christ, our divine model, from now on I no longer exist for the world because my life is Christ and to die is gain.

Bl. Victoria Diez y Bustos de Molina (1901-1936)

In October of 1993, St. John Paul II beatified several bishops, priests, religious and lay people who were victims of the Spanish Civil war. While not wanting to provoke smoldering resentments still lingering for the horrific conflict that gripped the country of Spain during the 1930s, the Pope did want to acknowledge that there were devout members of the Church who were killed not for political reasons but out of "hatred for the faith." Bl. Victoria Diez, as a catholic school teacher, was particularly heroic in her witness.

She was born in Seville to a middle-income family. Her notable gifts of study made her an ideal candidate for education. She very much saw her role as a vocation to transmit not only the highest ideals of the liberal arts, but also the treasure of faith that safeguarded virtue and the highest ideals of her proud heritage. She spent much time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament and was very much involved in the pastoral outreach of her parish.

The 1930's brought in major social change to Spain. The last vestiges of a Spanish monarchy were extinguished in favour of a progressive democracy. The country was soon plunged into a bitter divide of rival alliances. Voted into power were those who favoured a socialist ideology. They were opposed by a Nationalist movement that wanted to preserve tradition. The rest of Europe took sides in advancing their own interests. Because the "Republica" elected government wanted to undermine and sever the Catholic Churches' foundational authority, catechesis in the schools was suppressed in favour of the newly declared national religion of atheism. Bl. Victoria Diez was one of many who were rounded up and marched to an abandoned mine shaft to await a firing squad. She encouraged the 17 others who were similarly sentenced to death by helping them to keep their focus and calm in the reward that awaited them.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

"Render unto Caesar what is Caesar's and unto God what is God's". Timely advice for us in today's world. To give God his due and to respect the laws of the land, if they reflect our Christian perspective. God often uses civil authority to discipline us. The Roman occupation of Jerusalem was



a punishment for Israel's sins and the Lord raised up Cyrus to rebuild Jerusalem and to restore Israel from exile.

But the Lord alone is our king. His kingdom is not of this world and it begins here in His Church, which tells of His glory among all peoples. Citizens of heaven, we are called to be a light to the world working in faith, laboring in love, and enduring in hope, as today's Epistle counsels.

We owe the government a concern for the common good and obedience to laws—unless they conflict with God's commandments as interpreted by the Church.

But we owe God everything. The coin bears Caesar's image. But we bear God's own image. We owe Him our very lives—all our heart, mind, soul, and strength, offered as a living sacrifice of love. We should pray for our leaders, that like Cyrus they do God's will until from the rising of the sun to its setting all humanity knows that Jesus is Lord.




