Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with thy whole heart, and with thy whole soul, and with thy whole strength. And these words which I command thee this day, shall be in thy heart: and thou shalt tell them to thy children, and thou shalt meditate upon them sitting in thy house, and walking on thy journey, sleeping and rising. Deuteronomy 6.3-7

Known as the "Shema," this passage serves as the Jews ultimate confession of faith in the Oneness of God who is to be adored in word and served in deed. Jesus echoes the verses as the greatest of the commandments. To not love God is to not know how to love one's neighbor.

Obviously, a major impediment in the love of God is not finding in oneself any burning desire to engage in a life of deep prayer or spiritual practices. This void of emotional or imaginative interest in pursuing the things of God is known as the sin of "sloth." Sloth resents the diligence and dedication required in committing oneself to spiritual goods. Sloth can lull us with soothing images of adorable, cuddly tree animals that move at their own slow-motion pace. Sloth can seduce us with the appeal to a lazy lifestyle of pampered indulgence. In a culture where so many of us are desperately absorbed by screen time, sloth is particularly a deadly infectious disease; overcoming sloth through proper spiritual hygiene – (prayer, rosary, confession, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, reading Scripture), stirs within us a debilitating aversion to practices that fall outside our range of pleasurable pastimes. Consequently, the soul dies by resisting life-saving grace.

The remedy to sloth is to combat the vice of spiritual sluggishness. Because commitment to a spiritual routine requires discipline and hard-work, the whiny shrill voice barking endless complaints within us needs to be defeated. We need to overcome the inertia of finding boredom in heavenly promises. The all-out effort of heart, soul, strength required to not allow anything or anyone else to dethrone God from his rightful sovereign place ought to shed our spiritual mediocre flabbiness. We keep before us the vision of our insipid and bland lives transformed into ever eager servants who accept no other paltry substitute than the glory that God intends.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Jesus came not to abolish the Old Testament law but to fulfill it (see Matthew 5:17). And in today's Gospel, He reveals that love—of God and of neighbor—is the fulfillment of the whole of the law.



Love is the hinge that binds the two tablets of the law. For we can't love God, whom we can't see, if we don't love our neighbor, whom we can.

But this love we are called to is far more than simple affection or warm sentiment. We must give ourselves totally to God—loving with our whole beings, with all our heart, soul, and mind. Our love for our neighbor must express itself in concrete actions, such as those set out in today's First Reading.

We love because He first loved us. As we sing in today's Psalm, He has been our deliverer, our strength when we could not possibly defend ourselves against the enemies of sin and death.

We love in thanksgiving for our salvation. In this we become imitators of Jesus, as Paul tells us in today's Epistle—laying down our lives daily in ways large and small, seen and unseen, our lives offered as a continual sacrifice of praise.
