Absolve, O Lord, the souls of all the faithful departed from every bond of sin and by the help of Your grace may they be enabled to escape the judgment of punishment and enjoy the bliss of everlasting light. - Prayer from Masses for the Dead, Roman Missal

For the month of November and its intensified time of prayer for all the deceased, the following inspiring story from the Hapsburg family is offered. During the 19<sup>th</sup> century, leading up to WWI, the noble Austro-Hungarian empire distinguished itself for its attempt to rule its subjects with a Catholic sense of justice and charity. Its last emperor, Bl. Karl, fought resolutely for implementing Pope Benedict XV's peace proposals to avoid the predictable carnage of those salivating for an escalation in armed conflict. Bl. Karl of Austria (beatified October 2004) died in exile trying to negotiate peace for Europe. Traditionally, the burial for a member of the Hapsburg family unfolded in this pious manner:

After the requiem mass, the funeral procession would knock on the door of the designated place of repose, a Capuchin monastery in the heart of Vienna. From behind the locked door, a question is posed, "Who is there?" In response, the numerous titles of the monarch would be given, "I am Emperor of Austria, Apostolic King of Hungary, King of Bohemia, Dalmatia, Croatia, Slavonia, Serbia..." The porter would respond, "I do not know you." The procession leader would knock a second time, and again the numerous titles of the Emperor would be listed in addition to all the significant accomplishments that the emperor had achieved during his lifetime. Again, the Capuchin doorman would respond from behind the locked door. "I do not know you." When attempting a third time to gain entrance, and having to provide an answer to the question, "Who is there?" this time the funeral leader would respond, "The emperor, a poor mortal and sinner." At this confession, the double doors of the monastery are swung wide open and a row of friars would be there to offer solemn prayers and lay the body at its resting place.

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The readings this weekend speak of the virtue of humility.

"He who is greatest among you shall be your servant; **12** whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and whoever humbles himself will be exalted."



And I will tell you this. Virtue and Vice is all about a difference in attitude and inner disposition.

What we learn here is that success in life often depends on your inner disposition, the kind of habits you have built up over the years, the kind of person that you are, in other words your character.

Jesus promotes humility as an essential disposition or a vital component of our Christian Catholic life. So what does humility look like? Well I thought the best way to tackle this is by looking at what it is not.

The opposite of humility is Vainglory. The desire to be applauded at all cost. A love of the "show." The vainglorious wants a big round of applause, and would do anything to get it including exaggerating achievements, taking all the credit for a shared task and lying to impress.

The humble on the other hand is content to go about their business without concern. Not looking for any type of recognition or recompense. They recognize that the author of all gifts is God himself. **Fr. Reg.**
